Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that all of our children and families are managing well during these challenging times. As we are now at the February holiday weekend, I thought it would be good to reflect on our experiences since the start of "Remote Learning" in January 2021.

Remote Learning

We all know that the Remote Learning or Home Learning our pupils have experienced in January 2021 is very different from the Home Learning experiences schools offered from April to June 2020. I think it would be fair to say that the changes came as a bit of a shock to everyone; pupils, parents and staff! It is quite right that there are increased expectations regarding Home Learning from all angles. There is now a much bigger expectation that the remote learning activities on offer are more reflective of a child's normal day in school. Since January 2021 all of our classes are now using Google Classroom much more than before. As part of a Scottish Government initiative we have been able to supply families who have requested, support with Chrome Books. More of our children now have digital devices to enable them to engage with Google Classroom and carry out Home Learning tasks. Across the school we have an almost 100% uptake on Google Classroom! This is amazing and is testament to all involved. Teachers providing remote learning lessons, pupils engaged and involved in the tasks and parents supporting, assisting and encouraging the children with their learning. We keep a close eye on engagement levels in all classes and on the class work submitted on to Google Classroom. This information shows us that the majority of our children are engaging with their school work and in learning remotely.

Google Classroom

Teachers are planning a wide range of different activities using Google Classroom. The live

sessions are proving very popular because the children get to see their classmates, teachers and support staff online and this has given our children and staff that sense of being together again as a class. We know that the children really like to see their teachers, support staff and classmates on the screen especially during these times when we can't be at school together. There have been some great videos uploaded showing our staff delivering PE lessons, dance lessons, art lessons, reading stories, teaching the children literacy and numeracy as well as delivering a range of other curricular areas.

Thanks to our Pupils

I would like to say a massive well done and thank you to our children for all of the hard work involved in carrying out Remote Learning. Our pupils have had to learn in a new way through the platform of Google Classroom. We know that learning at home is very different from learning at school! The achievements of our children during this time have been incredible. I have been checking out your work boys and girls and I am so proud of all of you!

We really appreciate the lengths our parents have gone to in supporting the children with home learning. We appreciate the challenges involved for all parents and especially for parents supporting children at different ages and stages with home learning. The Scottish Government announced that it is expected that children in Nursery and Primaries 1 to 3 will return to school on the week beginning the 22nd of February. The proposed date will be reviewed nearer to this time and we will communicate with you regarding the return to school date. We are really looking forward to welcoming our pupils back to Murray Primary School. There is no return date for the Primary 4 to 7 children, as yet. We will update you on when these year groups of children are likely to return to school.

P1 Enrolment

The enrolment process for pupils who will start school in Primary 1 in August 2021 has taken place. This year this was an online enrolment. I am delighted to share that we have received a number of enrolments for Primary 1 pupils for August 2021 and we will be in touch with these families to give information about the transition from Nursery to Primary 1. If anyone has a child who is due to start Murray Primary School in August 2021 and has not yet enrolled their child for school please complete the online enrolment form on the SLC website.

Keeping in Touch with Families

It is really important for us to make sure that we keep in touch with all of our families. Over the last few weeks staff have made calls to all of our families. The purpose of this was just to have a check in with families to find out how everyone was getting on with home learning and to offer any support.
