COVID-19

Pupils, staff and parents must not come into the school building if they exhibit any of the symptoms of Covid-19.

The symptoms are:

- a fever or high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste

Should your child become unwell at school then they will be isolated within a designated safe space in school until the arrival of an adult to collect them.

We appreciate your understanding in keeping the school as safe as possible. If a pupil or member of staff test positive for Covid-19 we will liaise with South Lanarkshire Council and Public Health Lanarkshire. Anyone who tests positive will be automatically notified to Trace and Protect. T&P will support the Head Teacher and other local authority partners in undertaking a risk assessment as set out in national guidance and local procedures.

Pupil Attendance

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school before 9.00am. There is an answering machine for this purpose. Unexpected absences will be followed up by school staff, in line with SLC policy. Parents who have to take their child out of school during the day for an appointment, should send in a note in advance and collect their child from the School Office.

We appreciate what a worrying time this is for everyone but if your child is well and able then they should attend school every day. Regular school attendance is essential for all of our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. There are 190 school days across the school year, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments. We appreciate that children are unwell from time to time and that there can be exceptional circumstances for absences, but we ask that you think carefully about keeping your child out of school. There is a strong connection between attendance and achievement at school. Absence is proven to have a significant negative impact upon a child's educational attainment.

Breakfast Club

The breakfast club will resume from **Monday 19th April 2021**. The breakfast club will run daily from **8.25am** until **8.45am**.

- Breakfast club is **free** for everyone who attends.
- It will run daily from **8.25am** until **8.45am**.
- Children will not be allowed entry to the school building prior to 8.25am.
- Children attending breakfast club will enter the school via the dining hall door.
- A socially distanced waiting area is marked outside the dining hall door.
- The cook will prepare breakfast items which will then be served to children at their table by Mrs Edwards, SSA.
- A limited menu will be provided cereal, toast or fruit with milk or water.
- Children will remain seated in the dining hall until 8.45am. They will then be directed to their designated playground areas.





Dress Down Days

The final dress down day for this session is **Friday 18th June**.

All children can come to school in their casual clothes and if you are able your child can make a small donation and 'chuck it in the bucket'. This is totally optional. Thank you in advance for your support with this.
