



Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

A very warm welcome to all of our new Primary 1 pupils and their families and welcome back to all of our returning pupils. Primary 1 children have enjoyed meeting their Primary 7 buddies who have been helping them settle in to school routines. Their interactions have been so positive and their learning conversations animated. Some children may still be a little anxious which is understandable, however please let us know as we are here to help and support you.

Entering/Exiting the School

A reminder of the timings are below:

P1 and P2/3 can come straight into the school building from 8.50am. They must sanitise their hands as they enter the building then go straight to their class.

At 2.55pm they will be dismissed from school. Can you please ensure that your child knows which gate they have to leave from. Our colour coded the gates make this easier for the children to remember.

Yellow Gate Car Park Gate Red Gate Bike Shed Gate Blue Gate Top Gate

P3/4, P4/5, P5/6 and P6/7 come into the playground as normal in the morning. At the 9.00am bell, P3/4 and P4/5 should line up at the ICT doors and P5/6 and P6/7 should line up at the bottom of the path, as they have always done.

They will be dismissed at 3.00pm and may leave from any gate.

Staff are at the gates at 2:50pm to ensure that children leave safely at the end of the day.

<u>Lunchtime</u>

There is no requirement for pupils to socially distance, but we continue to have two sittings in the lunch hall. The times are set out below:

12.15-1.00 P4/5, P5/6 and P6/7 12.30 – 1.15 P1, P2/3 and P3/4

Pupils are allocated to tables according to their classroom.

We know that different lunch sittings may be difficult for parents who would like their children to come home for lunch but again, we are committed to keeping pupils and staff safe. If children are going home for lunch we would ask that they stay at home for the full 45 minutes.

Please ensure the children do not have too many items in their packed lunches. Two or three items and a drink is enough for most children. Also, it is best to send items the children are able to open independently.

<u>Uniform</u>

We ask that all children wear school uniform and bring indoor shoes to change into each day.

- Grey black or navy trousers, skirt/ pinafore
- White polo shirt
- White shirt and school tie
- Navy sweatshirt crew or V necked
- Navy cardigan or jumper

Please label all children's clothing clearly.

We ask all parents/carers to support the school by encouraging your child/ren to adhere to the agreed dress code and the wearing of school uniform. The wearing of a school uniform promotes the identity of the school in the local community and helps create an ethos of sharing and pride in the school.



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In line with current Covid-19 guidance, PE can now take place indoors or outdoors. Whilst mitigations remain in school, children should come dressed in appropriate clothing on their allocated days as our changing rooms will remain closed. This includes trainers, jogging trousers/leggings, a school/plain polo shirt, as well as a waterproof jacket in case your child's class goes outside. Please remember that, in line with South Lanarkshire Council policy, no football colours can be worn. Crop tops are also unsuitable for wearing to school.

Learning and Teaching

Pupils have been provided with all stationery and resources that they will require for use in the classroom. Our number one priority is the safety and wellbeing of all of our pupils.

School Admin

We have issued the children with a big brown envelope with a number of forms to complete, as we do at the start of each session. Thank you to everyone who has returned these documents. Please complete as soon as you can if you have not already done so. It is important we have your most up to date contact details and your child's medical information. Could I also remind you that if you change your phone number, or emergency contact details change, please make sure that you inform the school office and give them a note of your new number. It is also important that we have an up to date email address as the majority of our communications with parents and carers are via email.

Pupil Absence

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school before 9.00am. There is an answering machine for this purpose. Unexpected absences will be followed up by school staff, in line with SLC policy. Parents who have to take their child out of school during the day for an appointment, should send in a note in advance and collect their child from the School Office.

COVID-19

Pupils, staff and parents must not come into the school building if they exhibit any of the symptoms of Covid-19.

<u>Gardening</u>

Each class will take responsibility for a garden area within the school grounds over the course of the session. The children are currently weeding and preparing their areas in preparation for sowing seeds. If you have any gardening equipment in good condition that you no longer use or seeds that you can spare, we would very much appreciate any donations.

P4/5 and P5/6 Youth Music Initiative



Our P4/5 and P5/6 classes are enjoying a block of virtual music lessons delivered by a specialist music teacher. These lessons will take place weekly for 20 weeks.



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Breakfast Club

The breakfast club resumed on Monday 23rd August 2021.

- Breakfast club is free for everyone who attends.
- It runs daily from 8.25am until 8.45am. •
- Children are not be allowed entry to the school building prior to 8.25am. •
- Children attending breakfast club enter the school via the dining hall door.
- The cook prepares breakfast items which are served to children at their table by Mrs Edwards, SSA.
- A limited menu is provided cereal, toast or fruit with milk or water.
- Children remain seated in the dining hall until 8.45am. They are then directed to their designated playaround areas.

Multisports Club

An after school multisports club for our P3/4 and P4/5 pupils begins this Thursday. It will be run by Lesley Scanlan, our Active Schools Co-ordinator and will be supported by some of our senior pupil play leaders. Multisports clubs for the other stages will run before Christmas. Punctuality

We continue to have a number of children arriving to school late and coming in via the main entrance. In line with Scottish Government and SLC guidelines, this is a restricted area which should only be used by prior consent. Children should enter the playground through the three available gates. All late comings are marked on the attendance register. If there is an unforeseen emergency which is going to result in children arriving late to school, the school should be notified of this prior to 8.50am. This will allow us to ensure safe working systems within the school.

Water in Class

Children are encouraged to sip plain water in class as research has shown that this increases their concentration when learning. This should be in a plastic sports bottle to avoid spillage. Please note that juice, fizzy juice and flavoured/sparkling water are not permitted in the classrooms as they leave a terribly sticky mess if they are spilled and may spoil someone's work. Water is also served at lunchtime and support staff refill bottles over the course of the day if required.









Homework Support

We have a timetable of homework support for each class during lunchtimes over the course of the week. Children who do not complete their homework at home will be advised by their class teacher to attend the lunchtime club. It is very important that children complete the allocated homework as it helps to consolidate what they have been learning in class.

Participatory Budgeting

We value the support of parents/carers in the ongoing work of the school. Mrs Marnie has contacted all parents and carers about joining a Participatory Budgeting Committee. This session, we have over £3000 (5% of our Pupil Equity Fund) to support children and their families and to find ways to improve the learning and wellbeing of the children within Neilsland Primary School. The Participatory Budgeting group consisting of parents/carers and pupils will come up with 3-5 suggestions on how the money can be spent. Once the suggestion list has been created, the whole school community including all parents, staff and pupils will have the opportunity to vote for their preferred choice of spend.
