



Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

It has been lovely to welcome some brighter, sunnier weather over the past few weeks – a sure sign that Spring is on its way!

There has also been a very welcome easing of restrictions in school to allow mixing between class groupings. This has resulted in us being able to resume some activities such as mixed group after school clubs, paired reading and shared learning experiences.

COVID-19

Covid-19 Please remember that if your child has any of the coronavirus symptoms listed below, he/she should isolate straight away. You should book a PCR test via www.nhsinform.scot, or by calling 0800 028 2816.

You should book a test through Test and Protect if you or your child has:

- A new, continuous cough (coughing for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours)
- Fever/high temperature (37.8°C or greater)
- Loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste.

Children will be sent home from school if they are showing symptoms of coronavirus. If your child is feeling unwell with different symptoms, you should treat those as you normally would.

In line with the new guidelines, children can return to school if someone in their household or one of their close contacts receives a positive PCR test. However, they should take daily lateral flow tests (LFTs) for a period of 7 days and must test negative every day. If a child has a positive LFT and develops symptoms, he/she should then arrange a PCR test. If a child tests positive on a LFT but has no symptoms, there is no longer a requirement to book a PCR test to confirm the LFT result, but your child should still self-isolate for a period of 10 days. You can, however, end the isolation before the end of the 10 days provided your child has returned 2 consecutive LFTs taken at least 24 hours apart, with the first test being completed no earlier than Day 6. Even if both these tests are negative, your child should still not return if he/she has a fever. For further guidance on self-isolation, please look at the NHS Inform website.

LFTs can be collected from a local pharmacy, local collection points, as well as from regional and local test sites. They can also be ordered online for home delivery.

Please keep us updated on a daily basis regarding any absence and the results of any tests as this affects the absence code that is recorded for your child.

Eco

We are absolutely thrilled to announce that we have been awarded our **7th Green flag** for our ongoing commitment to Eco work. The Eco Committee is very successfully led by Mrs Gilroy and Miss Henry and is enthusiastically and regularly attended by a number of children from each class. The Eco Committee organise and lead a range of initiatives throughout the school. Their most recent venture has been to encourage the use of reusable water bottles instead of single use plastic water bottles. The Eco committee ran an enterprise initiative, selling personalised stainless steel water bottles. The response was overwhelming. Thank you so much for your ongoing support.

We have also been selected as one of four primary schools across South Lanarkshire to have an orchard planted. A selection of apple and plum trees were planted last week in our outdoor learning garden. We look forward to taking care of them and using the fruits in the future as part of our work on food and nutrition in school.

Pupil Attendance

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school before 9.00am. There is an answering machine for this purpose. Unexpected absences will be followed up by school staff, in line with SLC policy. Parents who have to take their child out of school during the day for an appointment, should send in a note in advance and collect their child from the School Office.

We appreciate what a worrying time this is for everyone but if your child is well and able then they should attend school every day. Regular school attendance is essential for all of our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. There are 190 school days across the school year, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments. We appreciate that children are unwell from time to time and that there can be exceptional circumstances for absences, but we ask that you think carefully about keeping your child out of school. There is a strong connection between attendance and achievement at school. Absence is proven to have a significant negative impact upon a child's educational attainment.

Eat Them to Defeat Them

The whole school is currently taking part in South Lanarkshire Council's 'Eat Them to Defeat Them', campaign, the purpose of which is to encourage children to eat more vegetables. The project runs for a period of 5 weeks, with a focus on a different vegetable each week (carrots, peppers, broccoli, tomatoes and peas). P3/4 are leading the project across the school. Each day, the children will be offered different recipes using one of the vegetables as the main ingredient. Children will then be encouraged to come and try some of them, if they wish. A pack explaining more about this campaign was sent home with every child, so please look this in your child's schoolbag.

Virtual Classroom Visits

We hope that you enjoyed the virtual class visits which were posted on Google Classroom last week. They will remain on the class stream and can viewed anytime.

<u>Fun Friday</u>

Our house captains and vice captains are going to be running a 'Fun Friday' session for each class on 1st April. They are organising and running a series of activities over the course of the day for all classes. They are remaining tight lipped about their plans – but I'm pretty sure that they will include an Easter egg hunt!





Homework Club

We have a homework club in school which runs daily at lunchtime. This allows children access to technology and adult support to complete homework. Class teachers will direct children to the homework club if homework is not being done at home.

Swimming

Our P5 and P6 pupils have started their 12 week block of swimming lessons at Hamilton Water Palace. This is a fantastic opportunity for them to develop water confidence and an essential life skill.

Dress Down Days

The last 2 dress down days this session will be;

All children can come to school in their casual clothes and if you are able your child can make a small donation and 'chuck it in the bucket'. This is totally optional. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

'Spring Clean'

It may seem a strange thing to be asking at this time of year, however, if you are planning a spring clean, we are always looking for donations of unwanted Christmas presents and items that we can use in the Christmas shop. These can be brought into school anytime and would be much appreciated.

Uniform

We have noticed that **a number of children are not wearing school uniform**. We ask all parents/carers to support the school by encouraging your child/ren to adhere to the agreed dress code and the wearing of school uniform. The wearing of a school uniform promotes the identity of the school in the local community and helps create an ethos of sharing and pride in the school.

We ask that all children wear school uniform and bring indoor shoes to change into each day.

- Grey black or navy trousers, skirt/pinafore
- White polo shirt
- White shirt and school tie
- Navy sweatshirt crew or V necked
- Navy cardigan or jumper



Children should come dressed in appropriate clothing on their allocated P.E. days as our changing rooms will remain closed. This includes trainers, jogging trousers/leggings, a school/plain polo shirt, as well as a waterproof jacket in case your child's class goes outside. Please remember that, in line with South Lanarkshire Council policy, no football colours can be worn. Crop tops are also unsuitable for wearing to school.

Donation

Last week we received a substantial donation of packets of felt tip pens from a member of our extended school community. There was enough for several packets per class. The children were absolutely delighted. We are very grateful. Thank you.

Breakfast Club

Our breakfast club continues to run as normal. There is no need to register interest. Children can attend the breakfast club as and when suits.

- Breakfast club is free for everyone who attends.
- It runs daily from 8.25am until 8.45am.
- Children are not be allowed entry to the school building prior to 8.25am.
- Children attending breakfast club enter the school via the dining hall door.
- The cook prepares breakfast items which are served to children at their table by Mrs Edwards, SSA.
- A limited menu is provided cereal, toast or fruit with milk or water.
- Children remain seated in the dining hall until 8.45am. They are then directed to their designated playground areas.

Transition

Our P7 pupils visited Calderside Academy last week. They worked with the Art and Technical departments. Despite some initial nerves, they had a fantastic time and cannot wait to return.

As we approach our summer term we know there will be lots of questions about our usual timeline of events. We have to be honest and say our plans for P1 induction, and P7 end of term assembly are dependent on Scottish Government and SLC guidelines. We will hopefully know more as we return after Easter and will update you all in our usual ways. We desperately want to run as close to normal as possible but will need to operate within Covid-19 parameters.

School Fund

Our school fund is used to purchase various resources and fund activities within the school. Recently we have purchased the online panto for all classes at Christmas time, Christmas gifts for P1-3 children, party treats and prizes for all classes, nativity costumes, gardening equipment and plants for all classes, books for new children coming in to P1, reading schools texts, Active Literacy boards for P1 pupils and we are currently planning to buy a shed to house our 'rake and take' rail and canopies for the infant playground.

<u>General</u>

We would advise all children coming to school on a bike or a scooter to wear a helmet.

Have you used your writing for pleasure jotter?


The children's responses were:

82% of the children surveyed are using the stationery stations and find them useful.


The children's responses were: 100% of children surveyed want a stationery station in their class next session.

Clubs

This term we have run various clubs such as P4-7 Rugby, P1-4 Breakfast Book Club, P3 and P5 Torchlight Book Club, P5-7 Literacy Club, P1-3 Dance Club, P4-5 Dance/Gymnastics Club, P5-6 Jigsaw Club and P6/7 Cooking Club.

All clubs are free of any charges. We are hoping to offer a guitar club to our Primary 6 pupils after the Easter holiday and we will use a portion of our Participatory Budget to fund this club. We are excited to get this club up and running and we will keep you updated. Watch this space!

Outdoor Learning and Resources

Mrs Marnie has successfully completed Fire and Tools Skill Training and will be working with small groups of children to develop their skills. We will be using some of our Participatory Budget to purchase resources to deliver this area of the curriculum.

Punctuality

South Lanarkshire Council monitor pupil punctuality and absences in all schools. At Neilsland, we track the punctuality of our children and Mrs Marnie reports on this on a monthly basis. In the month of January 4.7% of pupils were late for school. This reduced to 3% in the month February. We know that family circumstances change and if we can support you with these changes please do not hesitate in contacting the school.

ICT Lending Library/Supported Study

The classes in the upper school have been enjoying taking a Chromebook home to complete their homework via Google Classroom. Mrs Marnie has organised the use of iPads for the lower school classes to take home to complete their homework via Google Classroom. If you wish to use an iPad for homework, please contact Mrs Marnie.

South Lanarkshire Council has introduced Supported Study classes for P5-7 children via Google Classroom. Each week your child's teacher will post the classes on offer for the week with the Google Classroom codes. Some of our children have been enjoying learning Makaton, Spanish and Technology. Chromebooks and iPads are available for our children to use in order to access the classes.
