Equity Update

Punctuality

Punctuality is monitored every month in Neilsland Primary School and during the month of September there was an increased number of children being late for school. Being on time for school is important to your child's learning. Being 10 minutes late daily means your child is losing 50 minutes of learning each week and over four weeks this amounts to 3 hours 20 minutes. This is almost a whole day of learning lost each month. The school offers a breakfast club from 8.25 am every day and this allows the children to have a chat with their friends and to have their breakfast.

Period Products

A gentle reminder that we offer free period products to those pupils requiring them. The products can be accessed from the toilets within the school. If extra products are required during school holidays, please contact the school office.

Rookie Rockstars

We were delighted to welcome Rookie Rockstars into the school to work with the children on themes of self-esteem and anti-bullying. The children learned songs during class time and on the 15th November held their Rookie Rockstar concert in front of parents/carers. The Rookie Rockstar experience provided a real-life context for our children to develop skills in performing and becoming confident individuals. Rookie Rockstars come into school free of charge and use the ticket money sales from the concerts to fund their service. We as a school wanted to provide this opportunity to our pupils and subsidised each ticket sale by £2.50 of the £5 ticket cost.

Foodbank and Family Wellbeing Assistant

We replenish the school's mini foodbank on a weekly basis, and it is there to support our school community. We are all aware of the continuing impact of the 'Cost of Living' crisis on family budgets. If you need support with food, please contact Mrs Marnie.
