# Attendance/Late Coming

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school before 9.00am. There is an answering machine for this purpose. Unexpected absences will be followed up by school staff. If absence falls below 95%, attendance procedures will be followed in line with SLC policy and guidelines. Parents who have to take their child out of school during the day for an appointment should give advance notice and collect their child from the school office.

We continue to have a number of children arriving to school late and coming in via the main entrance. Children are expected to enter the playground through the three available gates before 9.00am. All late comings are marked on the attendance register. If there is an unforeseen emergency which is going to result in children arriving late to school, the school should be notified of this prior to 8.50am. This will allow us to ensure safe working systems within the school.

#### **Punctuality**

The school tracks punctuality and if children are continually late, parents/cares are contacted and invited to a meeting. Being 10 minutes late daily means your child is losing 50 minutes of learning each week and over four weeks, this amounts to 3 hours 20 minutes. This is almost a whole day of learning lost each month. The school offers a breakfast club from 8.25 am every day and this allows the children to have a chat with their friends and to have their breakfast.

#### **Rights Respecting School Award**

Many of our assemblies focus on children's rights. Each month, Mrs Marnie discusses a right with our pupils. Here are some of rights the children have been learning about:

#### Article 4 (implementation of the Convention)

Governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.

Article 29

Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.

#### Article 18

Both parents share responsibility for bringing up their child and should always consider what is best for the child. Governments must support parents by creating support services for children and giving parents the help they need to raise their children.

The new rights that the children will be learning about are articles 17 and 19.

There is an award that schools can apply for. The award is called the 'Rights Respecting Schools' award. We will be applying for this award and hopefully we will achieve bronze level. The Pupil Council will be working with the whole school community to achieve this.

We are all excited about World Book Day on Thursday 2nd of March. Pupils can come to school dressed as their favourite book character. They can bring in the book representing their character to share with classmates or bring in an item relating to a favourite book to show and tell.
