# Pupil Attendance

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school before 9.00am. There is an answering machine for this purpose. Unexpected absences will be followed up by school staff, in line with SLC policy. Parents who have to take their child out of school during the day for an appointment, should send in a note in advance and collect their child from the School Office.

Regular school attendance is essential for all our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. There are 190 school days across the school year, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments. We appreciate that children are unwell from time to time and that there can be exceptional circumstances for absences, but we ask that you think carefully about keeping your child out of school. There is a strong connection between attendance and achievement at school. Absence is proven to have a significant negative impact upon a child's educational attainment. **Currently, our overall attendance is 91%**

# <u>P5 Games</u>

Our P5 pupils will be attending P5 Hamilton Club SL Games at Jock Stein Leisure Centre on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> June. The event offers Primary 5 pupils from Hamilton, Blantyre, Larkhall & Uddingston the opportunity to experience and be inspired by the wide range of sports available within the South Lanarkshire area. They will experience judo, football, tennis and cricket and will rotate round the sports throughout the day.

## <u>Transitions</u>

We are currently working in partnership with Calderside Academy and Hamilton Grammar to ensure the smooth transition of all of our P7 pupils. The P7 pupils who will attend Hamilton Grammar School have a 2 day visit planned on **Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> May and Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> May**. Calderside Academy has been in touch to organise a visit on **Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> May 2023 and Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> May**. More information will follow soon.

The P7 pupils are busy making plans for their end of term assembly. The assembly will take place on **Thursday 22nd June at 1.30pm**.

We have 2 induction dates organised for our pupils coming into P1. The visits will be on **Wednesday** 24<sup>th</sup> May 1.30pm-2.30pm and **Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> May June 11.00am-12.30pm**. Our new pupils will spend time in class with their teacher and will get to meet their P7 buddy. They will also stay for lunch on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> May.

# <u>Sports Day</u>

We will be having a whole school Sports Day on **Wednesday 21st June at 1.30pm** (weather permitting). More information will follow. Parents/carers are welcome to attend.

# <u>Clubs</u>

This term we are running various clubs such as P1-7 Dance Club, P4-7 Booktasting club, P2 Games Club, P3 Art Club, P6-7 Football Club, P1 Gymnastics club and P5-6 Podcasting Club. All clubs are free of any charges. Many of the clubs are led by our pupils. We are very proud of the enthusiasm shown by our pupils in taking responsibility to develop their leadership skills. All clubs within the school are well attended. To date, almost 80% of our pupils have attended at least one extra curricular club this session.

## <u>Classes</u>

At the moment, we are looking at staffing and planning for 7 classes next session. Class composition and staffing are both subject to change, however, it is our intention to tell the children which class they will be in next session before we break for the Summer holidays.

## <u>Swimming</u>

Our P4 and P5 pupils are almost halfway through their 12 week block of swimming lessons at Hamilton Water Palace. This is a fantastic opportunity for them to develop water confidence and an essential life skill. The children are making great progress and are an absolute credit to the school.

# Scottish Cycling Sessions

We are delighted to be involved in this pilot programme delivered by Scottish Cycling and funded by Transport Scotland, - aimed at providing an opportunity for coached cycling sessions from Clydesdale Colts cycling club coaches. The sessions consist of fun and progressive cycling activities in our school grounds, to help each rider to become more confident in riding a bike and to develop a love of cycling. Each rider is also shown how to carry out safety checks of their bikes and helmets and how to carry out simple bike repairs.



We were busy enjoying lots of different reading activities last term. World Book Day in March was a great success, a big thank you to our Class Reading Champions for organising a fantastic book themed day! Primary 2 were the well-deserved winners of their 'Decorate A Door' competition, they created a fabulous 'Where the Wild Things are' themed door and were delighted to each be presented with a book to celebrate their win, well done!

As the weather improves, we are looking forward to spending more time outdoors under our listening tree to read together and having our book barrows out in the playground at playtimes and lunchtimes so we can read with our friends. Our Primary 6 pupils are looking forward to a visit from some of the nursery pupils from Woodlands to our library to read some stories together. The Primary 6's have chosen some books they think their visitors will enjoy and are practising using funny voices and actions to tell their stories!

Some of our P6 and 7 pupils are running the Reading Owls lunchtime club where classes can drop into the library to read and enjoy reading based activities they have planned.

Our Primary 5 pupils will soon have the opportunity to 'apply' for a librarian position in our Neilsland School Library. The successful candidates will visit Fairhill Library to find out how it is run and the skills they will need to run our school library and how they can encourage pupils to visit it. The Primary 3's and 6's have recently enjoyed visits to Fairhill Library. They were taught by Kathleen how to locate books in the library using the Subject Index and learned to tell the muchloved story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen using Makaton sign language. The P3 pupils presented Kathleen with a book containing some Read and Recommend posters that all pupils created in school. We hope that other children visiting the library will have a look and it will help them choose a book they would like to read too. Some of the posters will be displayed on the library walls, look out for them on your next Fairhill Library visit!



We will be submitting our Reading Schools evidence soon and are hoping Neilsland becomes a Gold Reading School by the end of the session. Our Gold Reading School Targets are displayed in our Reading Forests and have also been posted on Google Classroom in each classes Book Buzz Area for you to look at.

You may have noticed some writing on the pavements outside the school recently, Primary 3 and 7 wanted to share their love of reading with the local community and went outside to write some of their favourite quotes from books they have read on the pavement in chalk, they had great fun!
