Pupil Attendance

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact the school before 9.00am. There is an answering machine for this purpose. Unexpected absences will be followed up by school staff, in line with SLC policy. Parents who have to take their child out of school during the day for an appointment, should send in a note in advance and collect their child from the School Office.

Regular school attendance is essential for all our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. There are 190 school days across the school year, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments. We appreciate that children are unwell from time to time and that there can be exceptional circumstances for absences, but we ask that you think carefully about keeping your child out of school. There is a strong connection between attendance and achievement at school. Absence is proven to have a significant negative impact upon a child's educational attainment. **Currently, our overall attendance is 93.1%**

Danceathon/ Neilsland's Got Talent /Easter Fun Day/ Dance Festival

Our P6/7 pupils have been extremely busy, organising a Talent Show, Danceathon and Easter Fun Day for the full school.

Pupils were able to showcase their talents in front of the whole school during the talent show after a rigorous round of class-based auditions. Everyone agreed that Neilsland certainly does have talent!

On Friday 15th March, P6/7 hosted a Danceathon for all classes, parents and carers to tie in with Comic Relief. It was lovely to invite our adults into the school. The event was enjoyed by all and we raised over £100 for Cimic Relief. Thank you.

Today, all classes enjoyed an Easter Fun Day. P6/7 organised a range of games, events and activities for all classes. Every child received a small gift to wish them a Happy Easter.

This year we have a group of children who are taking part in the Dance Festival held in Hamilton Townhouse on Wednesday 1st May. They are practising hard with Caitlin, our dance instructor. After only 2 rehearsals so far, their performance is already of a very high standard. We are really looking forward to their debut!

<u>Transitions</u>

We are currently working in partnership with Calderside Academy to ensure the smooth transition of all our P7 pupils. We have had various visits from staff and pupils with more visits planned for next term.

We have 2 induction dates organised for our pupils coming into P1. The visits will be on **Wednesday 22nd May 1.30pm-2.30pm** and **Wednesday 29th May June 11.00am-12.30pm**. Our new pupils will spend time in class with their teacher and will get to meet their P7 buddy. They will also stay for lunch on Wednesday 29th May.

<u>Swimming</u>

Our P4 pupils have started their 12 week block of swimming lessons at Hamilton Water Palace. This is a fantastic opportunity for them to develop water confidence, an essential life skill. The children are making great progress and are an absolute credit to the school.



Scottish Cycling Sessions

We are delighted to be involved in this programme delivered by Scottish Cycling and funded by Transport Scotland, aimed at providing an opportunity for coached cycling sessions from Clydesdale Colts cycling club coaches. The sessions consist of fun and progressive cycling activities in our school grounds, to help each rider to become more confident in riding a bike and to develop a love of cycling. Each rider is also shown how to carry out safety checks of their bikes and helmets and how to carry out simple bike repairs.

<u>School Fund</u>

We continually aim to reduce the cost of the school day for our pupils. We do not charge for extra curricular activities. Our Parent Council are currently in discussion with our Pupil Council regarding suggestions for the school and proposals to spend some of the monies raised.

Our school fund is also used to subsidise the transport cost for all trips taking place before the end of the session. This will help to ensure that costs to families are kept to a minimum.

Our P3/4 class have recently enjoyed a trip to David Livingstone Centre as part of their studies in class. P6 and P7 pupils enjoyed a taste of the arts yesterday when they went to see Legally Blonde at Eastwood Theatre.

<u>Travel Plan</u>

We would like to thank our Parent Council and our whole school community for their active involvement in the development of our new School Travel Plan. The travel plan was officially launched last night at our Parent Consultations and has been emailed out to everyone. Traffic has been flowing more freely since the nursery staff started using the school parking area. This has allowed more spaces for collection at the end of the day which has in turn almost stopped the double parking. The Learning Hub have also changed the timings of courses taking place and this has also helped to reduce congestion at the start and end of the day.

There are 6 pledges in total and it is our intention to apply for our third pledge 'Hear their voice' before the end of the session. On successful completion of each pledge, we receive a jigsaw piece for that pledge with the aim of completing the jigsaw at the end of the process.

Fun with Maths and Family Cooking with YCFL

Caroline Stewart recently ran another course of family cooking sessions where parents/carers came along to cook with their child/ren, working together to make nutritious, tasty food. The smell of pizzas cooking was lovely. Parents/Carers enjoyed getting the opportunity to meet and chat with one another and the children looked forward to their arown-ups coming into school to cook with them.

Caroline also ran a series of maths workshops for P1 pupils and parents. Families had the chance to explore different maths concepts in a fun, interactive way using maths sacks. Each maths sack contained a different variety of activities, games and resources. Maths sacks were taken home to use over the week and then swapped over at the next session. Feedback was very positive with pupils and their families enjoying learning together.

Tae Kwondo Taster Sessions

Scottish Child Payment

Scottish Child Payment is a new benefit which started in February 2021. This payment is for families on certain benefits or tax credits.

Scottish Child Payment helps towards the costs of supporting your family. It's a weekly payment of £25 that you can get for every child you look after who's under 16 years of age. You'll get the payment every 4 weeks if your application is successful.

<u>Attendance</u>

We continue to work together with all stakeholders to improve attendance at Neilsland Primary School and our attendance rate to date is 93.1%. From August 2023, we have been looking at the days where most absence occurs, and our data shows that Friday is the day when most children are absent. We have compiled a table showing the number of absences each day.

Day of the Week Number of Absences

- Friday 420
- Monday 344
- Wednesday 331
- Tuesday 312
- Thursday 307

The main reason for absence has been holidays and the school so far has had 194 absences due to holidays.
