Several Scottish girls football teams participated in the Barcelona Girls Cup in October 2025. This tournament took place in Barcelona. Ariana was captaining the Scotland team and scored the qualifying goal which took them into 2nd place overall. We could not be prouder.







Emotion Coaching

We wil soon be running two information workshops which will focus on Emotion Coaching. We use this approach in school daily to support our pupils.

What is Emotion Coaching?

- Emotion Coaching is a communication tool that uses moments of emotion to guide and teach a child or young person about more effective responses.
- Accepts all emotions as normal and healthy (but not all behaviours), and considers what the feelings, needs and emotions are behind the behaviour.
- It enables us to potentially diffuse and de-escalate situations.
- Emotion Coaching helps children to feel seen, appreciated and cared for.

Why Emotion Coach?

Emotion Coached children and young people:

- Achieve more academically in school
- Are more popular
- Have fewer behavioural problems
- Have fewer infectious illnesses
- Are more emotionally stable
- Are more resilient

(Gottman 1997)

This approach is particularly effective in school and we feel that it could also be very useful within the home environment. The workshops will be delivered over two friendly, relaxed sessions by our Educational Psychologist, Heather Smith.

They will take place on **Tuesday 11th November** and **Monday 24th November** from **1.45pm-2.50pm**. We look forward to welcoming as many parents/carers as possible. You can book your place on Parent Portal.





Primary 7 Transition

Transition for our Primary 7 pupils is well underway with Calderside Academy. All pupils and parents/carers had the opportunity to attend an open evening in September. The feedback from this event was very positive. Mrs Calder, HT from Calderside attended our parent consultations in October to answer any questions that parents/carers might have had about Calderside and/or transition. A group of pupils have also worked with Mrs Reid from the English department over a number of weeks, developing their writing skills. Mrs Reid will also join us to watch P7 showcase their learning at their class assembly.

P7 Calderside Connections

All of the primary schools in our Learning Community took part in a special 'Calderside Connects' event on Tuesday 7th October 2025. This event took place across two schools in Blantyre: Auchinraith Primary and Calderside Academy, Blantyre Miners Welfare and Terminal One. All children participated in three different activities over the course of the day. All of these activities focused on aspects of mental, physical and emotional wellbeing, team-building and building resilience. All pupils had a fantastic day and had the opportunity to get to know children from different schools.

You + Me Multiply workshops

Mrs White recently ran a series of maths workshops for our Parents. The workshops aimed to develop adults' number knowledge, build strategies for problem solving and increase confidence in counting, structure of number and the four operations in order for them to better support their children's learning at home. She is currently running the workshops for P2-4 parents. The workshops are well attended and will run for P5-7 parents after Christmas.

Weekly Assemblies

Our weekly whole school assemblies take place on a Friday. Each assembly is themed eg Reading Schools, Children's Rights, Action Poverty and STEM. We present awards to children from each class based on our school values, we celebrate birthdays and someone is presented with a Golden Positivity Balloon.

In Neilsland, we monitor punctuality and attendance on a daily basis. This year we are aiming for **95% total attendance**, and we continue to ask for your support to achieve this.
