Attendance and Punctuality

Article 28 from the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) states that:

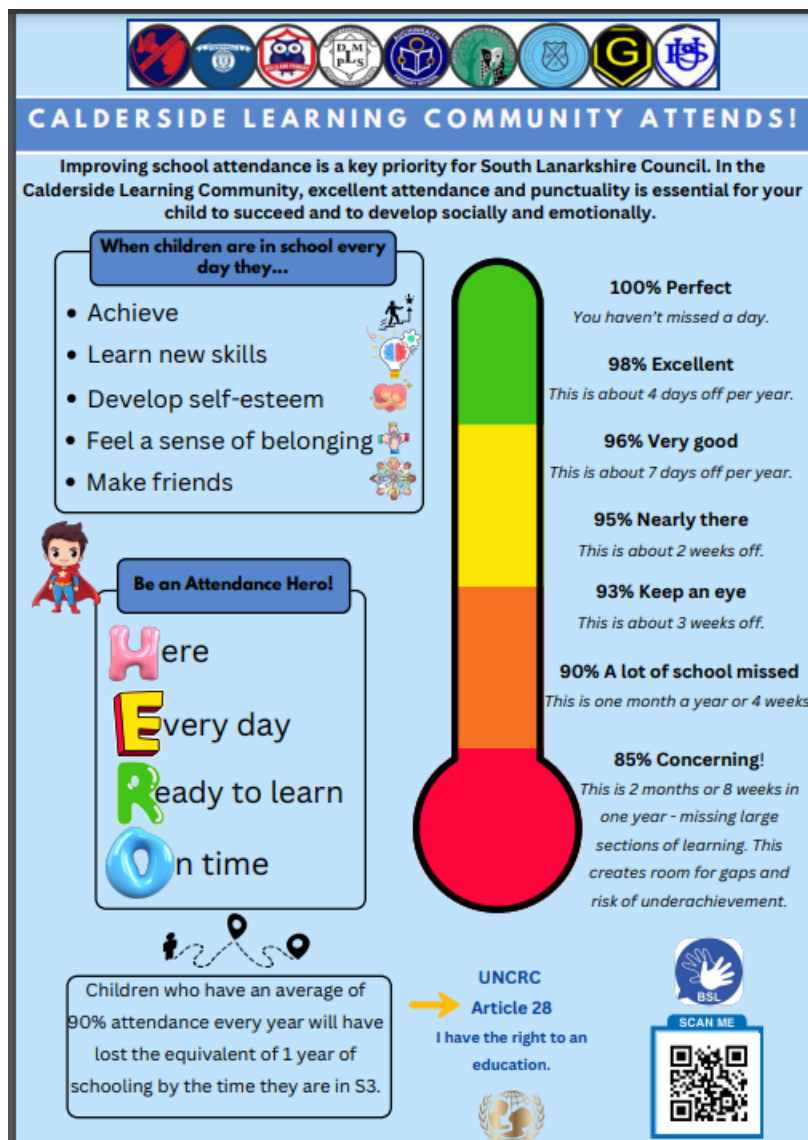
Every Child has the right to an education.



One way Neilsland Primary implements this article is through closely monitoring punctuality and attendance. Our aim for this academic year is to have an attendance rate of 95%. The school has a **responsibility to monitor attendance closely** and when a child's attendance falls below 90%, we will need contact with parents/carers to discuss the reasons for this and to provide support to improve a child's attendance at school.

If a child's attendance falls under 90%, letters will be sent home and follow-up phone calls will be made. Over the next month, the school will be looking again at sending further letters home if your child's attendance has fallen below 90% or if there has been limited improvement in attendance. If there has not been an improvement in a child's attendance the school will implement the next stage of South Lanarkshire Council's attendance procedures. Our current attendance as a school is: **94.5%**

All schools withing Calderside Learning Community have a shared approach towards the promotion of excellent attendance.



Christmas

We enjoyed all the festivities in the lead up to Christmas. We had two very successful Christmas performances, all children had a Christmas party, we had 'Gies a Break' in school with their panto, our school fayre, some very happy winners of the class hampers and we ran our usual Christmas Shop. Emotion Coaching

In November we ran Emotion Coaching workshops for parents. We use this approach in school daily to support our pupils.

What is Emotion Coaching?

- Emotion Coaching is a communication tool that uses moments of emotion to guide and teach a child or young person about more effective responses.
- Accepts all emotions as normal and healthy (but not all behaviours), and considers what the feelings, needs and emotions are behind the behaviour.
- It enables us to potentially diffuse and de-escalate situations.
- Emotion Coaching helps children to feel seen, appreciated and cared for.

This approach is particularly effective in school and we feel that it could also be very useful within the home environment. The workshops were delivered over two friendly, relaxed sessions by our Educational Psychologist, Heather Smith. The feedback from those who attended was very positive.

Open Session

We will be holding an open session on **Tuesday 24th February for all pupils**. You will be able to come along at 2.00 - 2.50pm to join in with your child/ren's class based activities. It is a great opportunity to work alongside our pupils and see the resources and teaching methods used in the classroom.

Easter Fun Day

We are going to have an Easter fun morning for all classes on **Thursday 2nd April**. This will be organised and run by our Primary 7 House Captains. There will be lots of fun activities planned and the children can wear casual clothes to school.



P4 Swimming

Swimming starts for our P4 pupils on **Tuesday 10th March** at the Hamilton Water Palace. Pupils should bring a towel, swimming trunks/costume and £1 (returnable) coin for a locker. The school has a supply of towels and swimwear for use if required.

Extra Curricular Clubs

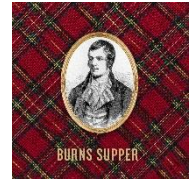
- The multisports club is run on a Monday lunchtime by Mrs Kennedy.

P6 Euroquiz

Some of our P6 pupils will be taking part in P6 Euroquiz at Newton Farm Primary School on **Thursday 26th February**. Euroquiz is an annual project open to all P6 pupils across Scotland, which sees teams of four working together to broaden their knowledge of Europe and the wider world. Subjects covered include languages, history, geography, culture and European affairs. Heats take place in from February to March, with the winning teams progressing to the National Euroquiz Final in June.

Online Safety

We often send out an email to all parents/carers regarding online safety

In the interest of pupil online safety, I would ask you to have an "MOT" of your young person's online presence, if they have one, as soon as you can possibly do so. (WhatsApp, Instagram, Snapchat, Tik Tok)

It has come to our attention that several of our pupils have been engaging in an inappropriate and offensive manner online.

At the same time I would also ask you to have a serious discussion with them about making sure any posts they make are both legally and morally responsible.

This continues to be an issue. I urge all parents/carers to check their child's phone/technology.

You+Me Multiply Parents/Carers Workshops

We will be running another set of You+Me Multiply workshops for parents/carers later in term. The workshops have a maths focus where Mrs White discusses how place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division is taught in our classes. In addition, they show games that can be used to practise the maths concept.



Weekly Assemblies

Our weekly whole school assemblies take place on a Friday. Each assembly is themed eg Reading Schools, Children's Rights, Action Poverty and STEM. We present awards to children from each class based on our school values, we celebrate birthdays and someone is presented with a Golden Positivity Balloon.

P7 transition

Transition for our P7 pupils is fully underway. There have been several visits from Calderside Academy teachers to work with the class. There was an open evening for pupils and parents prior to Christmas and some of our P7 pupils have taken part in a writing programme with Mrs Reid from Calderside. Mrs Calder, the HT at Calderside joined us for parent consultations in October.

P4 BEAM Project

Our P4 pupils are currently working with development officers from SLC on the BEAM project – Building Attendance, Engagement and Motivation. They are exploring their Scotland through a big question – decided by the class - What makes Scotland Wonderful? The children will lead and direct their learning over the course of the project. They have had 3 sessions so far and were delighted to explore Scotland using VRs during their first session.

Equity Update

Foodbank

We continue to offer our foodbank in our 'Rake and Take' shed and please feel free to take what you need. We also urge families to contact the school if they need further support and all phone calls are treated confidentially. Due to the weather conditions, it is sometimes difficult to put the uniform 'Rake and Take' rail out and if you are needing to replace uniforms, please come into school and we will organise this for you.



Participatory Budgeting

After consultation with the pupils, we have purchased 14 additional iPads (2 per class). They are now in use in classes. We have also purchased lots of new playground equipment. The music station has proved to be particularly popular!

Scarves, gloves etc

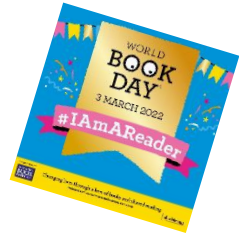
Sumdog

We have purchased a Sumdog licence for P4-7 pupils. Your child will be coming home with their Sumdog user name and password. If your child can use Sumdog at home for a minimum of 3 x 15 minute sessions per week, it will be of massive benefit to their learning.

Free School Meals
