Literacy

Reading

All of Primary 7 will be finishing Wonder then they will be splitting into groups to work on smaller novels to develop their fluency and comprehension skills

Group 1 will study War Horse and Group 2 will complete Charlie and the Chocolate Factory

1. Prior Knowledge – making connections between what has been read and our everyday lives
2. Metalinguistics – learning definitions and how to use new and unknown words from the text
3. Visualisations - displaying an understanding of what has been read through mind-maps, timelines and story plans
4. Inferences – identifying where the author uses inference and why
5. Main themes – discussing the main themes which arise in a text
6. Summarising – summarising what has been read in our own words

Writing and Spelling

A taught writing lesson will be given weekly and will include a variety of genres with the main focus being functional. The children will continue to develop their use of VCOP skills within written work.

Spelling words will continue to be given out on Monday and practiced daily using a variety of active approaches.

Grammar and handwriting will be covered on a weekly basis.
