

As a proud Eco School we always discourage the swapping of Christmas cards between children as this is a large amount of paper that is utilised for a short time and then thrown away. This year is no different. We would ask that children do not swap cards at school. Teachers will provide an opportunity for the pupils to make a card that will be displayed in the classroom for all the classmates to see.

Christmas Messages

We understand that children will want to wish their friends a Merry Christmas so we would encourage pupils to create a short video of themselves saying their Christmas message. Christmas Parties

Our Christmas parties are going ahead as normal this year and will be two-stage parties for P2-7, with P1 having their own special party, with a special guest. The parties will take place from 1-3pm so lunches will change for some classes

on the day of their party only. On Monday 18th P6/7 lunch will be 12.15-1pm. On Tuesday 19th P4/5 lunch will be 12.15-1pm. P1-3 children lunches are normally 1215-1 so no change to this.

Children are able to go home for a home lunch on the day of their party to get changed. Leaving from the front door and coming back through the front door also.

Children who are not going home for lunch will have the chance to get changed at lunchtime so we would ask that party clothes are put into school bags. We would ask that high heels are not worn in the gym hall as they mark the wooden floor.

Christmas Performance

Our Christmas Show will consist of our Nativity 'Lights, Camel, Action' performed by P1-3 and P4-7 entertaining us with some Christmas songs. Morning performances will take place on Tuesday 19th and Wednesday 20th December with a 9.30am start. Parents are asked to queue at the main office, the doors will open at 9.20am.

Tickets are on sale via ParentPay, starting with two per family.



Our Core Values - 2. Equity

Last year we looked again at our Visions, Values and Aims and, in consultation with pupils, parents and staff, we updated them. They continue to be proudly displayed all round our school and discussed regularly in classes and at whole school assemblies. Our second value is **Equity**.

Equity in education means that personal or social circumstances such as gender, ethnic origin or socio-economic background, are not obstacles to achieving educational success and that all individuals reach their potential.

Here at Newfield we have always tried to ensure that no pupils are discriminated against on grounds of socio-economic background and we are able to do this by using our Pupil Equity Funding money, our School Fund and money donated by the Parent Council to pay for events and subsidise outings for **all** of our children, no matter their background. We always try to keep costs to a minimum and our PEF money has allowed us to have many educational workshops and visitors we otherwise would not have been able to afford.

We have looked at school events through the lens of Cost Of The School Day to ensure that events are spread throughout the year, Parents/carers get as long as possible to pay for any events and large costs are minimised through use of fundraising and our Pupil Equity Funding.

We also ensure gender isn't a barrier to learning. All of our clubs and activities are open to Girls and Boys in the school and pupils are chosen for events outside school on suitability not gender. We are conscious of promoting all subjects and careers to all pupils and often discuss stereotypes with the pupils related to male and female dominated professions. We try to encourage all our pupils, no matter who they are, to try hard and be the best version of themselves that they can be. The sky is the limit!
