Our Core Values – 3. Achieving

Last year we looked again at our Visions, Values and Aims and, in consultation with pupils, parents and staff, we updated them. They are proudly displayed all round our school and discussed regularly in classes and at whole school assemblies.

Our third value is **Achieving**.

Academic achievement is regularly celebrated at our assemblies as well as in class with the pupils. Certificates, points, stickers are all given in recognition of achievement in the curriculum. We ensure recognition is given to all pupils for their achievement at their working level, not just those who are furthest on in the level. The end of term prize giving is the formal event where academic achievement is recognised and celebrated.

We share all achievement with our wider school community of our Twitter page.

We ensure that achievement in areas not related to the curriculum are also celebrated. This is done in class and at assemblies, determination, effort and kindness are all recognised.

Out of school achievements are celebrated at whole school assemblies and pictures posted on our school Twitter page.

We always encourage the pupils to share their successes no matter where they take place.

Our Star of the Week wall at the office ensures the wider school community can see all successes of our pupils. As well as the big celebrations that take place, teachers and support staff ensure that daily achievement is celebrated and highlighted. Every day our hard working pupils are making progress through the curriculum and gaining knowledge and skills. You may receive this information from your child personally or it may be written in their Ready Steady Learn.

Improvement Plan Update On Progress

Throughout the school year, alongside the day to day teaching, staff are working on our school improvements. Here is an update on how we are getting on with them:

- 1. Our Leadership groups are all busy working on their priorities. Masterclasses change every term, ensuring pupils get a wide variety of experiences. Our extracurricular clubs continue to be popular and take place at lunchtimes and after school. We held our community event which was very successful and we have forged some good relationships from that.
- 2. Three staff are currently undertaking the Talk 4 Writing Leadership training course as part of our improvement in Writing attainment across the school. We are completing work on our new school library and hope to have this finished soon. This also links with our Reading School Gold Award application that we are working on.
- 3. Play in our P1 class is continually evolving and changing to meet the needs of the pupils. Outdoor resources have been further developed for the rest of the school and we are continuing with our metacognitive work talking about our learning and how we learn.

Our support for learning timetable is still in place and constantly reviewed to ensure we are meeting the needs of our pupils with the resources we have.
