South Lanarkshire's Youth Forum on Climate Change & Sustainability

Established in August 2021, the SLC Youth Forum on Climate Change and Sustainability has been actively involved in a range of initiatives. Forum members have led impactful projects including establishing a news hub within the University of Glasgow during COP26, engaging with the authority's Climate Change Committee, organising a climate conference for P5 to P7 students (COS1), completing 'Teach the Teacher' training sessions to equip them with the skills and knowledge to engage their teachers on climate change and participating in a waste pilot and climate change app pilot.

In the current academic year, their focus was on organising a second climate conference tailored for S1 to S3 students, thereby expanding the influence and importance of climate change and sustainability awareness.



Chosen by the youth forum members, the COS2 event centred around the theme "A RESET", covering topics such as Attire, 3Rs, Energy, Shopping, Eating and Travel. This enabled them to concentrate on topics pertinent to the young attendees and aimed to enhance their comprehension of climate issues underscoring the impactful actions individuals can take, which resonate locally, nationally, and globally.

The conference welcomed 240 young individuals from 17 secondary schools across South Lanarkshire, featured key speakers and a supportive workshop on Green Careers, generously delivered by Scottish Power.

Overview of workshops:



Attire- explored the practice of fast fashion, its social and environmental impacts and different alternative strategies to limit fast fashion/waste.



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3Rs -educates on waste reduction, reuse, and recycling to combat climate change, emphasising the impact of single-use plastics on emissions.



Energy - educating others about the diverse renewable energy sources beneficial for our planet with a specific focus on wind power and wind turbines.



Shopping - explored altering shopping habits which can significantly affect our planet, spanning from our clothing choices to the food we consume and the packaging we utilise.



Eating - Food choices impact climate through production, transportation and waste. We can help by choosing local foods, composting, eating less meat and minimising waste.





Travel - Exploring sustainable travel options, focusing on their impact on carbon footprint, and utilising free bus travel for young people under 22 years.



We received a £10,000 grant from Community and Enterprise with a focus on Air Quality. This enabled us to buy merchandise for the young people. Each student got a tote bag, aluminium water bottle, coffee cup, notepad, and pencil.





The COS2 event had a significant impact on the young people who attended. By participating in workshops and activities centred around the theme of 'A RESET', these young people gained valuable insights and practical knowledge about sustainable living practices. Moreover, the opportunity to engage with key speakers and participate in workshops on Green Careers provided them with inspiration and guidance for potential career paths focused on environmental stewardship.

Additionally, the conference served as a platform for networking and collaboration among young people from different secondary schools across South Lanarkshire. This interaction fostered a sense of community and empowerment, as they realised they were not alone in their commitment to addressing climate change and promoting sustainability.

The positive feedback received through evaluations following the event reflects the impact it had on their awareness and understanding of these crucial issues, as well as their motivation to take action in their own lives and communities. Overall, the conference served as a catalyst for inspiring and empowering young people to become agents of positive change in the fight against climate change.

The conference had a notable impact on the attending teachers, with positive feedback indicating that it provided valuable opportunities for professional development, empowering teachers to address climate change and sustainability in their classrooms and communities.

Additionally, the networking opportunities provided at the conference allowed teachers to connect with colleagues from other schools, share best practices, and collaborate on initiatives to promote sustainability within their education settings.


