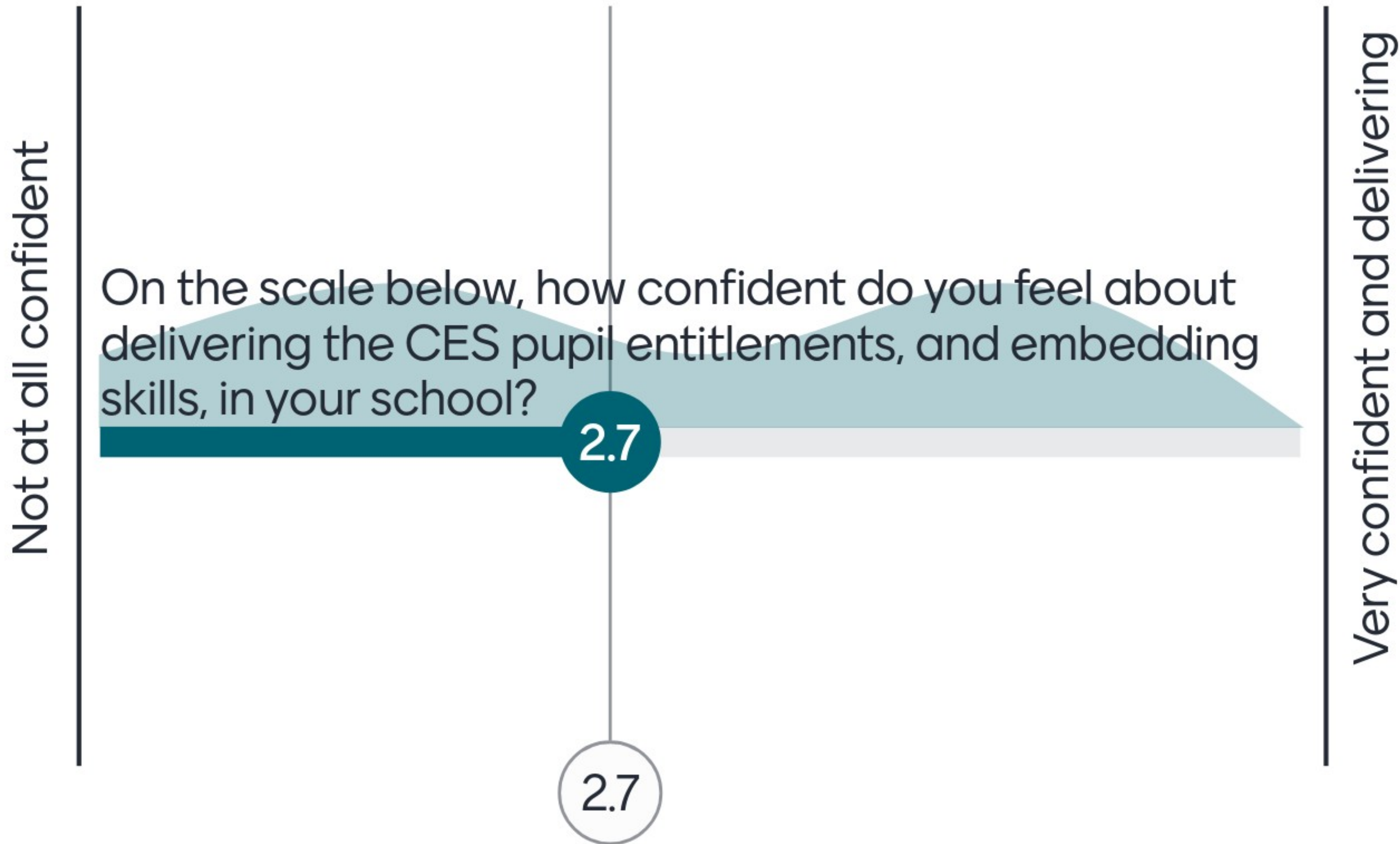


Initial level of confidence

CES is starting to be embedded in the curriculum however we will need time to do this fully.

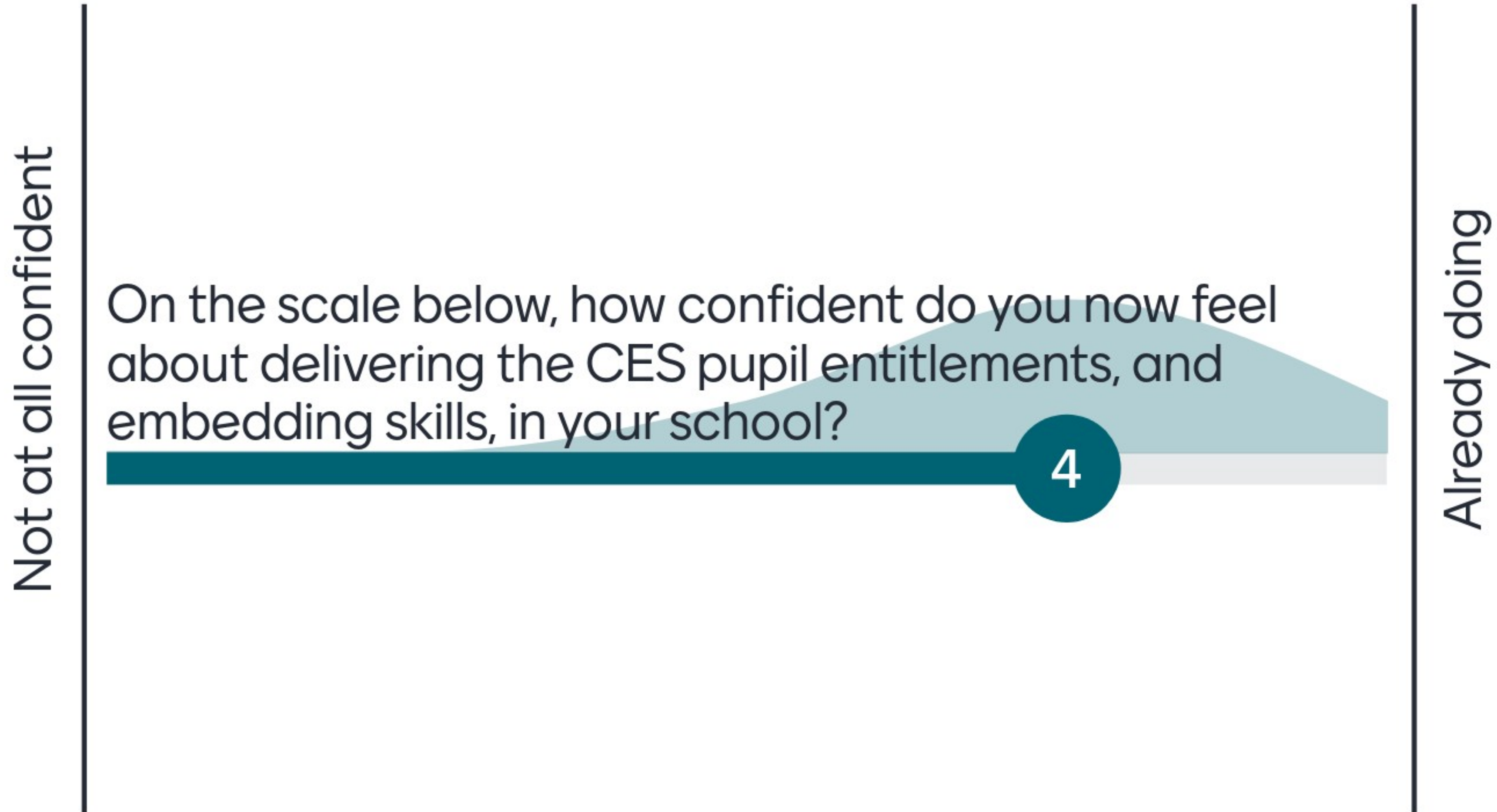
Having a careers adviser and a PT DYW to lead the agenda has resulted in SASB implementing a lot of the framework
