# PARENT'S REPORTING EVENING - THURSDAY 10th OCTOBER

Appointment times will be issued on FRIDAY 4<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER – PLEASE Check Bags!

On Friday this week your child will bring home their SNAPSHOT jotter, inside their INTERIM REPORT from the teacher and separately a note of your APPOINTMENT TIME on THURSDAY 10<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER

The SNAPSHOT jotter has a Parent Comment Sheet to be completed and the Jotter must be returned on MONDAY 7<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER. These jotters are very important as ongoing evidence of progress and activities undertaken. They also provide an excellent conversation starter for you with your child and for your child with the class teacher when they discuss your feedback and the suggestions you make for aress to work on.

These jotters will come home at three points in the year – October, March, June. For the majority of children who were with us last year the jotter will bridge work between last session and this – highlights progress, increased expectation. If you child is in P2-P7 and has a new jotter they are either new to us, completed their old jotter in June or the previous jotter was not returned.

PLEASE take time to note your comments to be discussed with your child

The Interim Report included is a short A5 report with key comments to be discussed further on Parent's Night. The Interim Report should remain in the jotter but be signed by a parent to confirm it has been read.

Parent Appointments will take place in your child's classroom with the Teacher. Children in P6 + P7 are invited to attend with their Parents. Children in P1-5 if attending should remain in the School Hall while parents visit the classroom – Staff and Senior Pupils will be on hand to supervise.

Given we have a growing school with 250 x children to accommodate the making up of Appointment Lists is a huge undertaking and begins in early September. Mrs O'Neill does a great job every year to fit everyone in and as such it is important that everyone sticks to their time and is aware that each appointment is approximately 7 minutes long.

At this time of year this time slot is usually more that enough but if there is a situation where you would require additional time after Parents Night to discuss issues further please contact Mrs McCarron P1-3 or Mrs Cleland P4-7.

All Reporting Appointments will be completed before we break up for October Break as we then return to the second half of the First Term.
