Important School Information - a reminder ...

***Nut allergies** – just a reminder to everyone that we are a nut free school. Children should not bring any snacks or items to school that may contains nuts or nut based ingredients.

*Fizzy drinks – fizzy drinks are not permitted in our school as they contain a vast amount of sugar which affects children's attention and behaviour.

*Health Promotion – we are a health promoting school and encourage our children to think about what they eat and drink. This includes snacks at playtime and lunchtime. Milk is available each week at a cost of £1.00 and a biscuit can be bought for each day of the week for the total cost of 10p. We are looking to set up a healthy tuckshop and more information about this will follow.

*Absences/Lateness/Leaving Early - If your child is to be absent from school, please phone our school office as soon as possible to inform us. We have an answering machine for your use. All children should be in the playground before the bell rings at 9am each day and we now have a bell ringing at 8.55am as a reminder to our children that 9am is fast approaching! The legal requirement is that children attend school from 9-3pm each day. If they are required to leave early, please bring your appointment letter to our office staff who will then note this. Lateness, absences and leaving early are recorded daily and if either of these become detrimental to any child's time at school, the council procedure is that an attendance officer will be asked to contact you to discuss further.

***Contact Details** - If your telephone number or e-mail address change throughout the course of the year, please do let our office staff know to allow us to update our records. This also applies to emergency contacts.

*Head Lice – We ask all parents and carers to please check hair regularly and if there is any case of head lice, please let us know so

*School Uniform – the children are very smart in our school uniform and we thank you so much for your great support with this. Please note that trainers are not part of our school uniform. Children need a full PE kit each week and will also require joggers and a warm top as each class has a timetabled slot each week for outdoor PE. Children are not allowed to wear jewellery during PE due to Health and Safety and earrings should be removed or covered. As the weather is now starting to turn wetter and cooler, all children should have a coat with a hood and be suitably clothed for outdoors.

*School Lunches – children who pay for their lunch should have sufficient money with them each day and should pay Janet (our Cook) before 9am. Our dining room doors are open from 8.45am for this purpose. If children do forget their lunch money, every effort should be made to bring it in the next day to allow Janet to record her monies accurately each week. If your child does not like anything on the lunch menu on any given day, a packed lunch should be brought to school.

*Car Park – please remember not to park in the disabled bays unless you have a relevant badge. Thank you to all drivers for being vigilant and careful whilst in our car park. Zig Zag Lines At Front Of Schoolplease keep clear for everyone's safety.

All of our Primary 1 children have been busy learning sounds and words. They are doing very well with their phonemes. They have also been doing lots of active learning and I was lucky enough to see their counting from 0-8 skills when I visited their class last week for a monitoring visit.

Across the corridor in Primary 1/2 the children have been focusing on addition and becoming more confident with key number concepts. They are working very hard and setting a superb example for our P1 children.

Primary 2 have been developing writing skills, focusing on becoming authors and have been attempting to copy the style of a particular author. They have been making great strides with this ... perhaps we have the next J K Rowling in our midst!

Primary 3 visited Vikingar last week to learn more about Viking life. They have been studying this topic very enthusiastically and thoroughly enjoyed their trip. The children were a credit to our school with their excellent behaviour, respect and engagement and everyone at Vikingar was very impressed.

Primary 5 have been learning about Cubist art recently and did some terrific pictures in this style. Move over Picasso... They also had a visit to Starbucks last week to learn more about Fairtrade coffee and recycling. Thanks to Starbucks for the recyclable cups and gingerbread men for the class.

P5/6 have been showcasing their skills in multiplication recently as well as addition. They have also been going in to classes to recite their poetry, created especially for National Poetry Day which was last Thursday 4th Oct.
