Weekly Assemblies

Thank you to all families who have been able to make it along to our Thursday Assemblies to celebrate good news and achievements in our school. It is wonderful to have you with us. If you have good news from home that you would like to share with us, please let us know as we would be delighted to share this at Assembly. We are always keen to hear of our children's many achievements...we are a very talented school!

Good to be Green

The majority of our children have had a very successful term by being on Green this whole term. This is wonderful news and we are delighted for them. The children will receive a reward card that will entitle them to a well deserved treat. I believe many of our families have promised treats at home too - thank you all very much for your support with our behaviour system, it is an important part of our partnership in helping to ensure the very best education for all of our children.

Important School Information

- *Nut allergies just a reminder to everyone that we are a nut free school. Children should not bring any snacks or items to school that may contains nuts or nut based ingredients. Thank you.
- *Fizzy drinks fizzy drinks are not permitted in our school as they contain a vast amount of sugar which affects children's attention and behaviour.
- *Health Promotion we are a health promoting school and encourage our children to think about what they eat and drink. This includes snacks at playtime and lunchtime. Milk is available each week at a cost of £1.00 and a biscuit can be bought for each day of the week for the total cost of 10p. We are looking to set up a healthy tuckshop and more information about this will follow.
- *Absences/Lateness/Leaving Early If your child is to be absent from school, please phone our school office as soon as possible to inform us. We have an answering machine for your use. All children should be in the playground before the bell rings at 9am each day and we now have a bell ringing at 8.55am as a reminder to our children that 9am is fast approaching! The legal requirement is that children attend school from 9-3pm each day. If they are required to leave early, please bring your appointment letter to our office staff who will then note this. Lateness, absences and leaving early are recorded daily and if either of these become detrimental to any child's time at school, the council procedure is that an attendance officer will be asked to contact you to discuss further.

We monitor absence levels, lateness and leaving school early very closely. This session, you will be informed if your child's attendance drops below 95% or if lateness/leaving early is becoming an issue. It would be really helpful for any appointments your child may have to be scheduled for out with school hours as leaving school early can have a detrimental effect on their learning in many ways. We appreciate your support in helping to ensure any disruptions to your child's learning are minimum throughout the school year.

- *Contact Details If your telephone number or e-mail address change throughout the course of the year, please do let our office staff know to allow us to update our records. This also applies to emergency contacts.
- *Head Lice We ask all parents and carers to please check hair regularly and if there is any case of head lice, it is helpful if you let the school know as soon as possible please.
- *School Uniform the children are very smart in our school uniform and we thank you so much for your great support with this. Please note that trainers are not part of our school uniform and named items such as Nike, etc should be kept for home. Children need a full PE kit each week and will also require joggers and a warm top as each class has a timetabled slot each week for outdoor PE. Children are not allowed to wear jewellery during PE due to Health and Safety and earrings should be removed or covered. I am delighted to see the majority of our children wearing the appropriate PE kits, thank you. The wearing of school uniform in our school is also excellent and the children wear it with pride.

Staffing Update

We are delighted to have Mrs Emmett back with us on supply every Friday. Mrs Emmett is working with our P6 children.

Mrs McCaig has begun her maternity leave and we look forward to hearing her good news!

Mrs Murphy will be teaching P3/4 every Monday and Tuesday and we thank her for being able to commit to this. Mrs Greene will be joining our team on a supply basis from Wed 23rd Oct to teach P3/4 every Wed, Thurs and Fri and we look forward to welcoming her. Further info about our fantastic school!

Student Teachers

Over the course of the year, we have several students who are placed with us to complete various placements. From Mon 21st Oct until Fri 22nd Nov, we welcome Mrs Cooper, a Post Graduate Teaching Student who will be working in our P5/6 class under the guidance of Mrs McGuire.

From Mon 4th Nov until Fri 13th Dec we welcome 2 further Post Graduate Teaching Students. Miss Devaney will be working in our P6 class under the guidance of Mrs MacIntyre and Mrs Emmett and Miss Moore will be in P3/4 under the guidance of Mrs Murphy and Mrs Greene. Both these students have been in our school for the past 2 weeks and have had a great introductory start to their placement.

From Mon 28th Oct, we have a Bed 3 student starting with us and Miss Campbell will be working in our P2 class under the guidance of Miss Brand.

Clubs in our School

During playtime each day, we will be having a reading club and an art/drawing club taking place. Some of our senior pupils will be helping to run these clubs, supervised by support assistants. This begins the week of the 21st Oct. Every Mon and Tues we will be having a dance club at playtime – this is initially for our P5-7 children and we will alternate this with younger pupils as the year goes on.

Our Active Schools Co-Ordinator, Fiona Woods, has been in touch to offer the following clubs for us and these also begin after the holiday week.

Multisport after school club for P4/5 children from 3-4 pm on a Mon, from the 21st Oct until the 9th Dec

Multisport lunchtime club for P6/7 children from 12.30-1pm every Wednesday from the 23rd Oct until the 11th Dec.

Milk and snack

We are bringing our milk and biscuit/snack idea back by popular demand! The children can order milk to enjoy in their classroom every morning. This is done through parent pay. They may bring a small healthy snack to eat at this time or can purchase a small biscuit (digestive/rich tea or cream cracker) to enjoy. The cost of the biscuit is 20p per week and children need to please bring the correct money on a Monday for the week. As we are a cashless school, we will not unfortunately have any change to be able to give them

Homework Diaries

Many thanks for your use of our homework diaries – we really appreciate you taking the time to write a note/sign the diary and it helps us all with another level of communication. Each week, a green stamp is put in the diary for all our children who have been green that week. If there have been any unfortunate times that a child has received a yellow or a red card, a dot of that colour is put in the diary on that day to help inform you that this has happened. No dot means they have been on green and this is celebrated with the green stamp at the end of the week. All of this is communicated through the use of our diaries.

Breakfast Club

We run a breakfast club each day in our school and this takes place from 8.15am until 8.45am. This is free of charge and open to all pupils in our school. Children should come to the front door of the school where a member of staff will register them and let them through to our dining hall for breakfast. Please note that children are not permitted before 8.15am.

P7 Residential Trip
