Dear Mums and Dads,

As we approach the end of our first term this session we would like to thank you and the children very much for your overwhelming support and approach to all our new procedures and routines. You will know that here have been many new routines we have implemented and the staff, children and yourselves have all helped to make these work really well. Thank you so much.

We now have 4 sittings in our lunch hall, one for our nursery children and 3 for our school children. Our dining hall is socially distanced to ensure adults are following government guidelines safely. All children sit in the dining hall in their class group (we also refer to these as bubbles) at an allocated seat which they have selected and all children follow a one-way system to help ensure mixing is reduced. Tables are kept 2m away from each other. We have introduced an afternoon break for some of our classes – the classes who have 30 minutes for lunch then have a 15 minute interval in the afternoon.

We have zones marked out in our playground for our children to play in and we have amended the organisation of which classes go for particular breaks and lunchtimes in order to try to ensure that 2 zones are available for each class to give our children more space to play.



We continue to be required to ensure appropriate ventilation throughout our school and nursery and windows are open all day throughout our establishment. As the weather continues to turn colder, we anticipate the children and staff will be required to wear extra layers and are proposing the wearing of school hoodies for everyone. More info about this further into our newsletter!



Our outdoor PE sessions are going very well and more of our children are now coming to school wearing dark joggers/leggings and their polo shirt. Again, thank you for your support with this also as we try to create uniformity amongst our children with their outdoor PE kit. When the weather is wet, the children will not go outdoors as we do not want them sitting in wet clothes during the day. We have a variety of alternative wellbeing activities that take place within the classroom should this be the case.

Breakfast Club

As yet there is no indication as to when our Breakfast Club will resume. I will keep you updated as I receive further information.

Sacraments

Congratulations to the children in our P4 stage who recently received the Sacrament of Reconciliation – Fr O'Farrell conferred this Sacrament in our school a few weeks ago and we are delighted for our children.

Our First Communicants will receive the Sacrament of First Holy Communion on Sat 24th Oct, we have 2 Masses taking place that day in Our Lady and St Anne's Church and the children are currently being refreshed in their preparation to help ensure they are as well prepared as possible. We would be delighted if you would keep them in your prayers at this time.

As yet we have had no further information regarding our children who have still to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation from June. This would be last year's P7 pupils. Our current P7 children will shortly receive information regarding the date for their confirmation which will be planned for later in this school session.

Google Classrooms

We are continuing to make use of Google Classrooms and homework has been posted on this platform for all our children. We understand that it can be difficult to get in to this site initially and if you are experiencing this, please come along to our school hall with your device on **Wednesday 7th October from 8.15-9.30am or 2.15-4.30pm** and we will hopefully help you to get logged in. It appears to operate differently on various devices, IT is certainly stretching and challenging us here in St Elizabeth's! If you cannot manage along on Wednesday, you are welcome to send your device to school with your child on Thursday as we will be helping pupils log in on this day.

Each child has been given a jotter and pencil to be kept at home in the event of them having to do work from home. Should you require any further resource ie paper, crayons, coloured pencils, etc please let us know and we will get these resources to you.

You will also shortly be receiving an information sheet giving you details of the logins and password required for your own child and an outline of how we would use Google Classrooms for learning moving forward.

Important School Information

- *Nut allergies just a reminder to everyone that we are a nut free school. Children should not bring any snacks or items to school that may contains nuts or nut based ingredients. Thank you.
- *Fizzy drinks fizzy drinks are not permitted in our school either as they contain a vast amount of sugar which affects children's attention and behaviour.
- *Health Promotion we are a health promoting school and continually encourage our children to think about what they eat and drink. This includes snacks at playtime and lunchtime. Milk is available each week at a cost of £1.00. This can be ordered through Parent Pay.
- *Absences/Lateness/Leaving Early If your child is to be absent from school, please phone our school office as soon as possible to inform us. We have an answering machine for your use. The legal requirement is that children attend school for the required hours each day. If they are required to leave early, please bring your appointment letter to our office staff who will then note this.

We monitor absence levels, lateness and leaving school early very closely. This session, you will be informed if your child's attendance drops below 95% or if lateness/leaving early is becoming an issue. Whilst we know it is not always easy to arrange, particularly in these current times, it would be really helpful for any appointments your child may have to be scheduled for out with school hours. We appreciate your support in helping to ensure any disruptions to your child's learning are minimum at this time.

- *Head Lice We ask all parents and carers to please check hair regularly and if there is any case of head lice, it is really helpful if you can let the school know as soon as possible please. Many thanks for your support with this.
- *School Uniform the children are very smart in our school uniform and we thank you so much for your great support with this. A wee reminder that trainers are not part of our school uniform except on a PE day and we would really appreciate if named items such as Nike, etc could be kept for home.
