In line with guidance, we are continuing to follow all health and safety procedures in our school and nursery. Regular hand washing continues to be in place in all our classrooms and playrooms, daily and weekly cleaning routines and high levels of ventilation. Whilst we monitor the temperature in classrooms, our children may need to wear their school hoody as well as a jumper to school as winter sets in. We are continuing to maintain 2m distancing between adults and children and all adults are wearing face masks.

All adults are asked to continue to please wear face masks within our school/nursery vicinity and we thank you very much for your fantastic support with this.



** Breakfast Club**

Our breakfast club runs from 8.15 to 8.45am each day and is open to any school child to attend. Children should arrive promptly and go through the dining room doors in the playground. We have a good attendance each morning.

**Our Curriculum Consultation **



Many thanks to all school parents and families who managed to complete our School Curriculum questionnaire. We have been working with our older pupils from P3/4 to P7 and with all our staff, reviewing and evaluating our curriculum.

Our aim is to review our Curriculum Rationale and Design to amend this according to the current needs of our school, our learners and our families. We are now in the process of collating all this information and forming our Rationale.

- *Religious events within the school and outwith. Pre Covid, coffee morning house system, parental engagement attending Bingo and playing games as a family.

- *Making everyone feel valued.
