We are looking forward to celebrating World Book Day with our boys and girls in school and nursery – children are very welcome to look out a favourite book they would like to bring to school or nursery next Thursday. ** Positive Relationships and Behaviour

During our recent in-service day, we reviewed our Positive Relationships and Behaviour Policy. A copy of the policy will be uploaded on to our website and school app for you to view. We will also issue an abbreviated version for your convenience.

As you will know, we have a Good to be Green system in place within our school and our children enjoy this system and respond very well to it. Part of this system involved yellow and red cards – the yellow card is used to indicate warnings and think time and the red card is for a consequence for inappropriate behaviour. In the event of a child receiving a red card, we will also give home a phone to inform you. We know you appreciate being kept informed of how your child is doing at school and your support is crucial to our work.

Our pupils have given us ideas about how we continue to recognise and also reward those children who remain on green week after week and they have come up with some great suggestions including a Good to be Green Card for each child, a sticker each week that goes on the card, a Head Teacher's Award at the end of term for consistent stickers and a sneaky play. **Attendance and Absence**
