Late Coming

Some children have been spraying their snack into other childrens' mouths and I am sure you will agree, this is not hygienic or healthy! We are also a Nut Free Zone and so children should not bring any snacks which contain traces of nuts.

In accordance with the NHS guidance, we would also ask that if you are sending in grapes for younger children, as a snack, they are halved to prevent choking.
