ANNUAL REPORT - 2019/2020

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Its been a year like none of us have ever experienced. The way school and life in general will look over the coming school year will be something we all have to adjust to.

2 OBJECTIVES

2.1 In September 2019 the Parent Council set nine objectives. We spent the following school year trying to achieve those objectives. This is how we got on:-

2.2 Fundraising group

A new fundraising group will be set up with those who previously expressed an interest in a fundraising group via a survey monkey.

This was successfully set up and the fundraising for this year was outstanding, particularly for the tracksuit. Unfortunately, the participation the group was not as great as hoped and it sort of petered out. We need more help from parents to raise funds.

2.3 Tracksuits:

One of the main objectives for fundraising this year is to raise money to purchase new tracksuits for the cross country events.

We managed to do this very quickly, with the gift a kit idea being particularly successful. The children were able to wear the kits at the cross country event in March. The kits will be retained by the school and used by the p6s and p7s for all future events.

2.4 High-Vis vests

The school wanted these for P1s.

Specsavers donated them to the school.

2.5 Social event

We wished to organise an event through the year which will focus on bringing people together within the school community and raise funds for the school.

We organised and promoted the Race Night. It had to be cancelled due to low numbers. We presume this was due to the emergence of the threat of coronavirus at that time.

2.6 Support core values

We wanted to help support the implementation of the new core values.

This is an ongoing objective, but in the last year we worked with Ms Feeley on the core values, providing input and helping with interviews and feedback when required.

2.7 Succession

Ensuring there is the chance of growth and succession within the Parent Council.

This year was the last year of Reg and Kathleen Smith, the former chair and vice-chair of the committee. They've worked tirelessly to help improve St Mary's and what it can offer our children. We welcomed three new members to the committee: Laura McNicol, Kirsty Lumosi and Matthew Farrell. Tracy Purves continued as treasurer. Dan O'Donnell is the representative from the Church. Lisa Fraser, Mhairi McMillan, Maureen Kelly, Kathleen Campbell, Anne Silver, Claire Newling and Julia Marrs have all made significant contributions over the year. We need more help.

2.8 **Polytunnel training**

In the 2018 / 19 school year, the committee raised money for a poly tunnel, plants and equipment. This year we wanted to put it to use. We wanted to organise training for the staff to help them with use of the poly tunnel.

Stuart from Castlebank park ran a Saint Mary's exclusive training session for the staff of St Mary's.

2.9 Communication

We wanted to improve how we communicated with the parents and carers to encourage more engagement.

We've increased our use of Facebook. We've helped encourage the use of the St Mary's APP by the school so that it has become the primary means of communication.

2.10 Improving and increasing social responsibility

We wanted to create an opportunity for our children to engage with community and understand the environment.

We were planning a litter pick for the last term of school. That became impossible. We will move this objective to next year

- 3.1 We're proud of what all of us together have achieved in the last year. As well as the above, we were also one of the best schools in South Lanarkshire for Beat the Street.
- 3.2 There is so much more that we can do. We haven't even begun to tap into the potential of the myriad skills of the St Mary's parent and carer group. We want to start a football and netball team. 1We want to continue to give our children the chance to try other activities like skiing and climbing. We want to put AstroTurf in the fenced area in front of the school. We'll do the litter pick. We want to increase our use of facebook.
