

Nursery Survey Results






We completed a nursery remote learning survey in February 2021. Here are the results...


How have you accessed information about School arrangements, nursery and learning during this current lockdown. (Tick all which apply)

16 responses




How regularly do you access learning journals?


We have tried to post a variety of suggested learning activities for you to consider doing with your child. Have you found them to be...


We have tried to keep children's individual targets up to date during this lockdown period. Have you participated in this process?


So far we have held 2 live interactions using Google Meet. Were you and your child able to participate?
