Staffing:

After school clubs and school activities:



We have started up several clubs in the past month: badminton for P4 on a Monday, boys football for P6/7 on a Tuesday, netball for P6/7 on a Thursday and a running club for P6/7 will be starting next Wednesday. We are delighted that lots of our children have signed up for these sports clubs. Our 7 a-side football team won their first tournament last week and will attend another one on 11th November. Additional sports activities for our younger children have been arranged for during the school day, Judo taster session for P.1-4 were given on Wednesday 3rd November and starting on Tuesday 9th November 2 week blocks of multi-sports will be delivered by our active schools co-ordinator to Primary 1, 2 and 3. Bikeability training for P.7s started a fortnight ago and the children (and staff) even survived a session in pouring rain. A 12 week block of swimming lessons for primary 5 children begins on Tuesday 16th November. A lunchtime book club, initially for p7 children will start on Monday 8th November. It feels great to be offering these opportunities again!

Toy Sale:



Last year due to the pandemic we were unable to hold our annual toy sale but this year it returns!! Our toy sale will be on Thursday 25th November. Families are invited to have a bit of a pre- Christmas clear out and donate toys and books which are still in good condition. Donations can be brought into school between Friday 19th and Tuesday 23rd November. On the day of the sale children with money will be given the opportunity to visit the toy and book stalls. A maximum of £1 can be spent by any child and initially purchases will be restricted to 1 per child to ensure all classes get the opportunity to buy something if they want to. All money raised will go into the school fund and contribute to Christmas parties.

Bookbug Day:

Our bookbug day will be on Friday 26th November. Primary 1 -3 children will attend a storytelling session in our open area and will bring home a bag of books and activities. We hope families enjoy exploring the resources in the bags together.

Children in Need:

We will have a children in need non uniform day on Friday 19th November. Children can come to school in Pudsey themed clothes if they wish or just simply regular non uniform day clothes. We remain unable to have parents into our school building for celebrations but we have lots of plans to make this festive time of year special for our children. A full list of Christmas fun will be given in the December newsletter. It will include, parties, stories in the grotto, Christmas lunch, Christmas jumper day, Bingo and a winter wonderland walk to see the work of other classes. Our nursery will record their version of the Christmas story to share with family and friends as well as the children in the school. Our P1 – 7 children will record a Christmas show which will also be shared.

Crossing Patrol:

We ask that all drivers stop when the crossing patrol sign is raised and that all drivers and pedestrians show respect for the important contribution that our crossing patrol officer makes.
