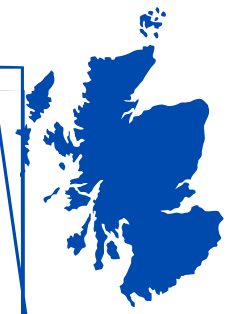


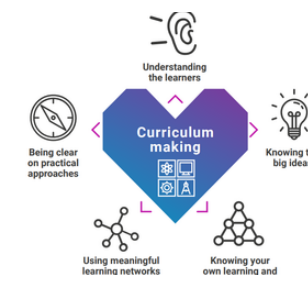
South Lanarkshire has 20 community nurseries, 125 primary schools, 17 secondary schools, a Gaelic medium provision and 7 additional support needs schools.
