
supporting the children in decorating their wooden spoon for

Learning with our younger children Term 1

Mrs Wilson is currently the green group's keyworker. The children have all settled quickly back into routine and mixing well with our older children within both playroom. Some of the children were part of a visit to Biggar where they attended a Bookbug session within the library, followed by a play at the Gillespie centre. The children are making full use of the opportunities to play indoors and out.

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Over the next few weeks we are planning more walks and outings in our local area. We'd love to see more parental contributions from home, enabling us to share in their life outside of the nursery. Over the next few

weeks we will be offering home visits for our parents before they transfer to our 3-5 room.







Home links - coming soon

Starting in September we will be sending out our library bags on a weekly basis. These will be going out on a Wednesday and we would ask that your return them on a Monday. Inside each book you will notice some helpful info for example some questions to prompt some further thinking or you may wish to some of the suggested follow up activities. These are entirely optional for you, but are there should you wish. If you decide to do some follow up experiences, we'd love you to share on the learning journal.

The children of last term had a surprise visit from an alien(toy!) who they named Olivia. Olivia will also be going home for visits this year starting in September. Olivia will be sent home in her very own special bag with the story Beegu. Please record the time spent with Olivia on the learning journal. The aim of Olivia is for the children to teach Olivia about our world.

Parental Involvement

It would be wonderful to have some regular parental involvement not just Mums! We are looking for Dads, Grannies or Papas. within the nursery, is there anyone who would like to be helper? This would involve a disclosure check (PVG) If so please see Mrs Miller.

Learning Journals

Within Tinto we use online learning journals, these allow you to directly share experiences and achievements from home, along with following the individual learning and development of your child. In addition to this your child has their own folder within the nursery, supporting them in leading their own learning. The children use these to collect work they create, photographs etc.

Your child will have a minimum or 1 observation/learning story on their learning journal, you will receive an email when your child has a new observation/story.

Last term we had some wonderful parental contributions from home, these can also help spark interests within the nursery. This can be done on your child's own learning journal. Ideally we'd love to see 1 parental contribution a week.
