Numeracy and Mathematics

This term in number the P5/6 pupils will be focussing on progressing their understanding of numbers and the number system, counting in multiples of thousands with bridging, comparing numbers, rounding and multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000. The children will read and write numbers to millions and recognise decimal numbers to 2 decimal places.

Pupils will investigate and apply a range of problem-solving strategies to support their learning when tacking word based problems. They will be encouraged to draw a picture or make a model of a problem, guess check and improve their working and reason logically.

We will continue to use a wide range of concrete materials, maths games including those showcased at our maths recovery afternoon, and online sites including Heinemann Active Maths and Prodigy, for which all children have been issued with login details.

Homework

In Primary 5/6 we are beginning to use a home links Google Classroom to share our learning and revision activities with you. All activities are consolidation of spelling, maths and French covered previously in class. These tasks will not be marked or assessed by a teacher but provide excellent support and revision.

Reading will be issued as homework to ensure we can progress through larger texts in a timely manner. Pupils will record their reading homework on a bookmark to save logging in digitally Tinto Primary School

Language and Literacy and Modern Languages

This term the children are reading the novel 'Holes' as a whole class text, exploring the themes of friendship and rights. We will be using a variety of Tools for Reading to support our class discussions. The pupils will investigate comprehension strategies including predicting, connecting, self-questioning, skimming, visualising, comparing, inferring, determining importance, summarising and paraphrasing, scanning, synthesising, prior knowledge, main ideas and metalinguistics.

In writing the pupils are investigating narrative texts through the PM writing scheme and revising our use of the description bubble to enhance our writing. We will also expand our knowledge of the Read and Write toolbar to support writing development in the class

We will continue to expand our knowledge and understanding of French in the classroom with basic greetings, the alphabet and phrases which appear in our daily routine.
