

Parking

We are continuing to be frustrated with the amount of inconsiderate parking around the Luss Brae entrance and on Lomond View. We continue to report our concerns to Police Scotland regarding these issues. Please do not park on the area highlighted below as they cause congestion and force oncoming traffic on to the wrong side of the road.



Please DO NOT park on the zig zag lines! This is selfish and unsafe for our pupils trying to get safely in and out of school.

A reminder that the school carpark is for staff and visiting specialists only, please make alternative arrangements when dropping off and collecting your child. We have noticed that a few cars have been parking at the end of the carpark and also in the emergency vehicle corridor- this is not permitted. Please park outwith the grounds and in a sensible space, then walk to collect your child/ren.



MOBILE PHONES and Online Safety

Pupils are discouraged from bringing any mobile devices, including phones, to school however, if they require them for after school, they must be switched off and in school bags at all times.

Recent escalations in online activities coming in to school calls for a focus on the online profile your young person may or may not have. Please be vigilant across all apps (WhatsApp, TikTok, Snapchat, Instagram etc.) as we are aware of engagement in content that could be viewed as offensive/inappropriate online, including images, altered images and comments that could be viewed as derogatory. We continually discuss how all online activity must be morally and most importantly legally responsible, please reiterate this message at home.

With an increase is smart watches being worn we also ask that these are silenced or on school mode to ensure no interruptions to the school day and learning of the pupils and staff.

Equity Updates

Punctuality and Attendance

As you know at Townhill we monitor our attendance and punctuality weekly, monthly and termly.

As of 26.3.2024 our whole school attendance was **94.4%.** We are really hoping to get this up to 96% before the end of term so please continue to support good attendance!

Lateness at school goes through spells at Townhill. Since August there have been a total of **238 lates**, this has been for 72 pupils with 30 of these children being late on more than 3 occasions. Punctuality at school is key to a happier and more settled transition to the school day as children don't miss out on key routines and jobs that happen first thong.
