

#### Parking.

We urge all parents/carers to ensure they embrace our safety guidelines around parking near the school and to share this with grandparents/aunts/uncles etc. that might be collecting the children. It is everyone's responsibility to keep our children and families safe. Please ensure you park safely in order to be able to get out of your car and ensure your child is safely on the correct side of the road to get to the playground gates.

We recently had our Health and Safety Assessment which also included a Traffic Management Audit. This report has highlighted our ongoing concerns and will now be looked at closely to help us continue to work to find solutions which are ultimately to keep our children safe.

A reminder also that the school car park should not be used to park and then walk up the lane to collect your child, unless a prior arrangement has been made with the school. The entrance to the school, including inside the gates, <u>must</u> be kept clear in the event of emergency vehicles requiring access to the grounds. Unfortunately there continue to be cars parking just inside the gates- please park out with the school grounds in a safe place. This also applies to the 'Drop Off' bay at Melfort Road. Please do not park in this to escort your child to school or collect them as we have had complaints from cars then trapped in the bay unable to leave.

Engine idling also remains a concern. Please familiarise yourself with the 30 Reasons campaign that South Lanarkshire publicise. You will see new signage which has been erected at both school exits to remind all adults collecting their child.

PARKING

A gentle reminder that the school carpark is for staff and visiting specialists ONLY, please make alternative arrangements when dropping off and collecting your child.

#### **Bug Busting**

From time to time we identify a day and ask all parents and carers to check their child's hair for Head Lice. If everyone checks on the same day it means head lice can be treated and we can break the cycle of re-infection. Could you please check your child's hair on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

We have attached a copy of the NHS Leaflet at the end of the Newsletter with the best advice for checking and treatment.

#### COVID-19

If your child develops any of the recognised symptoms of COVID-19 then they should not attend school and you should arrange to have a test.

The symptoms are:

- ✓ a fever or high temperature
  - ✓ a new, continuous cough
- ✓ a loss or change to sense of smell or taste.

We appreciate your understanding in keeping the school as safe as possible. Should your child become unwell at school then they will be isolated within a designated safe space in school until the arrival of an adult to collect them.

#### Attendance at school

If your child is well and able then they should attend school every day. Regular school attendance is essential for all of our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. There are 190 school days across the school year, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments.
