School Trips

As you know we have been desperately trying to organise a trip/outing for each class since covid restrictions were lifted. At our last TPTT meeting I spoke about balancing this with the Cost of School Day given the massive rise in bus costs. Unfortunately, as all schools clamber to arrange days out we are unable to fulfil bus needs. We simply cannot get buses

booked and any that were available were costing around £15 per child before any entry/activities were booked. I know this is very disappointing as some classes have been able to go on an outing but we this is not something we would have been able to foresee. All classes will have something fun before the end of term, either something local, a visitor or a fun activity. Next session we hope to have our trips and outings following a more 'normal' course.



Parking/Road Safety.

We urge all parents/carers to ensure they embrace our safety guidelines around parking near the school and to share this with grandparents/aunts/uncles etc. that might be collecting the children. It is everyone's responsibility to keep our children and families safe. Please ensure you park safely in order to be able to get out of your car and ensure your child is safely on the correct side of the road to get to the playground gates.

A reminder also that the school car park should not be used to park and then walk up the lane to collect your child, unless a prior arrangement has been made with the school. The entrance to the school, including inside the gates, <u>must</u> be kept clear in the event of emergency vehicles requiring access to the grounds. Unfortunately there continue to be cars parking just inside the gates- please park out with the school grounds in a safe place. This also applies to the 'Drop Off' bay at Melfort Road. Please do not park in this to escort your child to school or collect them as we have had complaints from cars then trapped in the bay unable to leave.

Engine idling also remains a concern. Please familiarise yourself with the 30 Reasons campaign that South Lanarkshire publicise. You will see new signage which has been erected at both school exits to remind all adults collecting their child.

We successfully launched our School Travel Plan with SLV last week and officially opened our new bike/scooter shelter. A huge well done to Mrs Kelly and the Junior Road Safety team!

There was a recent accident on Wellhall Road involving a pupil from our school. Fortunately, it was not as serious as it could've been but it has highlighted a few safety points. Please ensure that if your child is coming to school either on a bike or a scooter that they wear a helmet. Children do not need to be travelling at pace for a head injury t have serious consequences. We also ask that if your child leaves via the Luss Brae entrance and cross on to Wellhall Road that they MUST use the Lollipop man.

A gentle reminder that the school carpark is for staff and visiting specialists ONLY, please make alternative arrangements when dropping off and collecting your child.

Following last week's Shorts and Shades Disco I need to remind everyone of the expected conduct of all adults in and around the school estate. Unfortunately, a number of children arrived at the disco visibly upset due to a situation that arose within the car park. Our children have the right to come to a school event without being frightened and I would therefore encourage everyone to ensure that they maintain our expected high standards of behaviour and language in and around the school at all times. Luckily the incident dispersed quickly but in future Police Scotland will be called as a matter of urgency. Please support us with this, our children deserve it.

COVID-19

If your child develops any of the recognised symptoms of COVID-19 then they should not attend school.

The symptom to be particularly cautious with is:

✓ a fever or high temperature

We appreciate your understanding in keeping the school as safe as possible. Should your child become unwell at school then they will be isolated within a designated safe space in school until the arrival of an adult to collect them.

Attendance at school

If your child is well and able then they should attend school every day. Regular school attendance is essential for all of our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. There are 190 school days across the school year, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments.
