MOBILE PHONES

Pupils are discouraged from bringing any mobile devices, including phones, to school however, if they require them for after school, **they must be switched off and in school bags at all times.**

Unfortunately, we have continued to have issues with smart watches in school. These should be set to a 'school' mode where children are not disturbed during the day with messages and alerts. Please support us with this. Should you wish to get a message to your child then contact the school office. Similarly, children are **actively discouraged** from using their watch to communicate with others. This can be very distracting for staff and pupils.

Scooters/bikes in school

Many of our children cycle or scoot to school and we can now encourage this. <u>Anyone</u> <u>bringing a bike or scooter to school should make sure they wear a suitable helmet and</u> <u>reflective clothing and must get off their bike/scooter in the playground and push it to</u> <u>the bike shelter</u>. The school cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage to bikes/scooters while on school property

Summer Weather

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Summer has well and truly hit this week! Please ensure that your child has plenty of water with them and has had sun cream applied before coming to school. Children can also bring hats to wear at break and lunch. Please do continue to adhere to our uniform policy. Children can wear polo shirts and shorts to keep cool.





ALLERGY INFORMATION

There has been an increase recently of nut-based snacks being brought in to school. Can we please remind all parents/carers that these are not allowed an alternative should be given instead.

There are members of our school community who have severe allergies to some food items, therefore the following are not allowed in school:

- peanuts or products which may contain peanuts
- tree nuts such as walnuts, brazil nuts, almonds and hazelnuts etc.

* <u>Please note that this includes most chocolate spreads, Nutella products and Kinder</u> <u>Bueno. I would urge all parents/carers to bear this in mind when providing your child</u> with snack and/or packed lunches. Thank you for your support with this. This applies to <u>all pupils, staff and visitors.</u>

A reminder we are no longer able to take in and distribute birthday cakes/treats.

Attendance at school

If your child is well and able then they should attend school every day. Regular school attendance is essential for all of our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. There are 190 school days across the school year, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments.


