
## Snapshot- Numeracy

### Indoor shoes

They have no grip for the varying surfaces we have PE on and provide no foot/ankle support to the wearer. Please ensure that your child has suitable footwear in order to take part in PE activities at school.

### WORKING TOGETHER...

Parental partnership is very important to us in Townhill and we work very hard to build positive relationships with all our parents/carers, in order that we can work together to support all our children to reach their potential and feel happy and safe in school.

We are here to help so, in the first instance, please contact your child's class teacher via the main school office with any queries or concerns. Please refrain from approaching staff at the end of the day as we aim to have a quick clearance of the playground to adhere to guidance around adults and social distancing. I would ask that in all instances you contact the school directly and avoid posting your concerns on social media, as in our experience, many worries can be easily resolved with a quick conversation.

Should you feel that more support is required you may wish to contact a member of the Senior Leadership Team. In order that we can resolve any issues as quickly as possible our Leadership Team have pastoral responsibility for different stages within the school.

# Attendance at school

If your child is well and able then they should attend school every day. Regular school attendance is essential for all of our children to make good progress, achieve their academic potential and consequently have better chances in life. Our whole school attendance target is 95%. It is the responsibility of parents/carers and the school to achieve this. <u>There are 190 school days across the school year</u>, leaving 175 days to book holidays and attend non urgent appointments.

We appreciate that children are unwell from time to time and that there can be exceptional circumstances for absences, but we ask that you think carefully about keeping your child out of school. There is a strong connection between attendance and achievement at school. Absence is proven to have a significant negative impact upon a child's educational attainment.



# **Parking**

Please continue to make sensible choices when parking for drop off and pick up and respect the local residents' spaces. Unfortunately, in recent weeks there has been an increase again in unsafe parking on Lomond View. AS you drive along Lomond view towards the school, please avoid parking on the left-hand side near the corner. This forces cars on to the opposite side of the road to turn the corner and will result in an accident. Please also avid parking directly on the t junction at the end of Lomond View as again it forces moving cars to be on the wrong side of the road and is dangerous for all. Community Police will hopefully be starting their drop ins and will politely move folk on that are causing an obstruction. Please think carefully before pulling in, it is **everyone's** job to ensure the safety of our young people as they travel in and out of school and we are relying on all adults that drop off and pick up to make the right choice.

We also fully support the SLC engine idling campaign. Please ensure if you are parked your engine in off. I thank you for your continued support in this area.

We would therefore ask that if your child develops measles, chicken pox or shingles that you inform the school <u>immediately</u> so that the appropriate action can be taken.


Your child is not at any risk from this situation; however, the health of our pupil does depend on your cooperation in this matter.
