## PRIORITY 1: IMPROVING OUR CLASSROOMS (IOC)

### Strengths and achievements:

- · Almost all staff consolidated their learning in features of highly effective practice and improved teaching and learning within classrooms.
- · Almost all staff now trained in 'Maths Recovery'.
- · Increased parental engagement. Feedback from You+Me workshops (P3&4 families) was very positive, and parents felt more able to support their child.
- Staff participated in training on the BGE Toolkit which has supported almost all teachers to use data better to plan next steps. This is impacting on pupil pace and progress.
- · All stakeholders engaged in the Peer School Review process and collaboratively developed a new, streamlined Curriculum Rationale for the school.
- · Numeracy and Maths attainment has remained consistent. New resources have been introduced to support progress and enhance motivation and engagement.
- New baseline assessment tools created, and data collected from p1 pupils.
- . Next steps Attainment Data continues to highlight the need for improvement in standards of writing across the school.
- · Whole school implementing 'Explicitly Teaching Writing' to raise attainment. Targeted interventions at P1 (via Pupil Equity Funding) and P4 (National Writing Programme).



- All staff received emotion coaching training in August 2024 and a new PPRUDB support pathway was created based on attachment-informed practice.
- . The Focus Child approach has continued in P1&2 classes, with an adapted approach to Play, using Learning Journeys, Focus Child meetings and Pupil Friendly Reports.
- New Nurture Room opened to support pupils across the school with emotional regulation, self-esteem, and related needs.
- Monthly celebration of wider achievements now embedded in the school calendar, leading to increased parental engagement and recognition of pupils' broader skills and successes.
- . GMWP toolkit is now fully embedded in the annual Health and Well-Being assessment calendar. Pupil survey data has informed an Anti-Bullying Charter, termly school-wide focuses, and strengthened pupil voice.
- · Next steps: Nurture and attachment provision expanded with the creation of a Nurture Policy and a new sensory room to support pupil wellbeing across the school.
- Increased use of GMWP and Leuven Scale data to inform
- · ASPs to be used more effectively to support individual needs and discussed during parent/carer meetings.
- Obtain Attachment Pledge 1 Accreditation.

## PRIORITY 2: **OUTDOOR PLAY AND LEARNING**

## Strengths and achievements

- · PEF funding enhanced playground zones and storage, supporting the continued delivery of high-quality play experiences for all pupils during break times.
- · While progress linking OPAL to life skills development beyond P1 has been slower than planned, we remain committed to full integration as capacity allows, despite challenges from increased support needs.
- · Pre-entrant families attended a well-received OPAL transition event, providing a chance to explore playground resources and begin building relationships with new pupils and families.

Next steps: - Completion of Skills Planners and 'Our Plan for Play' document.

- · All staff to integrate Outdoor Learning into their curriculum and termly planning.
- · Continue to maintain playground zones by replenishing resources as needed, in collaboration with the Parent Council. Develop further partnerships with local businesses to support resource replenishment.



#### Strengths and achievements:

- · Learning Community collaboration to create a shared booklist focused on equalities and diversity, promoting a consistent approach across schools. Books were organized into class packs, leading to focused collaboration and moderation across the Learning Community.
- In September 2024, a baseline questionnaire assessed staff knowledge and confidence in equalities and diversity. Following moderation activities, staff confidence increased significantly: 71.6% rated it as very good (up 68.7%) and 20.9% as excellent (up 18%).
- · Next steps: Implementation of Equalities and Diversity calendar linked to school assemblies and Forward Plans.
- · Establish a new Depute Head/ Principal Teacher network to increase Learning Community links.
- · Audit of languages spoken at Udston Primary
- · Parental leaflets linked to UNCRC and Sustainable Goals
