







We will also explore poetry and write our own Autumn themed pieces. • Higher order comprehension skills of skimming and scanning, synthesising and comparing. • Active spelling strategies 	<p>Social Studies</p> <p>This term, we are focusing on Global Citizenship, with a focus on-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exploring the Rights of People around the world and how they differ. • Learning about the 17 Global Goals. • Looking at the similarities and differences of the children's lives in other countries compared to ours. • Geography based on where we are in the world. <p>Language & Literacy</p> <p>Read for pleasure! Read your class reading book every night. Talk to a parent or carer about what you are reading. Practise your spelling words using active spelling strategies. Go for an Autumn walk and record descriptive words and phrases.</p> 	<p>Social Studies</p> <p>Talk to an adult at home about the differences between rights in our country and other countries around the world.</p> <p>Find ways at home to look after the environment- e.g. recycling, energy use, food waste.</p> 	<p>Health & Wellbeing</p> <p>Go outside and play!</p> <p>Talk to a parent or carer about what bullying is and how to prevent it.</p> <p>Learn a new skill or take up a new hobby (knitting, painting, running, puzzles etc).</p> 	<p>Religious & Moral</p> <p>Go to the library and research the key values of Christianity and how they might be put into action in lives and communities.</p> <p>Retell a miracle story you have learned about in class and discuss at home.</p> <p>Find out about different Christmas traditions in our community. What Christmas traditions do you have?</p>
<p>Numeracy & Mathematics</p>  <p>Practise quick fire mental maths addition, subtraction, multiplication and division on Top Marks or Sumdog.</p> <p>Create a card or board game to help you learn key times tables facts (2-10 x tables)</p> <p>Look at how prices are recorded when you are Christmas shopping. (50p/ £0.50) Can you read and record prices both ways?</p> <p>Practise counting out coins for given amounts within £10. When you feel confident you could ask an adult to help you pay for items in a shop/ café</p>	<p>Technologies</p>  <p>Discuss internet safety and with people at home.</p> <p>Compose a story using the microphone function on Google Docs.</p> <p>Log on to Google Classroom, Education City and Sumdog.</p>	<p>Science</p>  <p>Visit the Science Centre.</p> <p>Help make the dinner and see which ingredients dissolve!</p> <p>Conduct your own investigation into materials which dissolve with the help of an adult! Make some predictions and record your results.</p>	<p>Expressive Arts</p>  <p>Visit a gallery or museum.</p> <p>Keep a sketch book of places you visit.</p> <p>Design your own Christmas Cards.</p> <p>Apply some of the skills you have learned during art sessions and create your own piece.
