Curriculum for Excellence What are we learning this term?



Primary 3- Term 1

Language & Literacy

This term we will focus on:


- Applying the 5-finger strategy when learning our phonemes.
- Higher order thinking reading strategies including prediction, visualisation and skimming and scanning
- Using our Talk for Writing programme to create a 'Rags to Riches' narrative piece, focusing on character description.
- Developing our listening skills to give and follow instructions.
- Working on our grammar skills, focusing on nouns, verbs and adjectives.
- In French, we will focus on greetings. numbers and colours.

Social Studies

Our topic this term is 'The Vikings'. We will:

- Explore people and places of significance in relation to the Vikings.
- Investigate important Viking artefacts and create our own.
- Use timelines to record key events in Scottish Viking history.
- Develop an awareness of the ways we remember and preserve Scotland's history, such as the fire festival 'Up Helly Aa'.
- Compare aspects of people's daily lives in the past with our own.

Health & Wellbeing



- We will create movement patterns and sequences within gymnastics.
- We will develop our knowledge of being and feeling safe at home and in school, stranger danger and how we might manage those situations.
- We will be looking at a variety of safe ways medicines are used to help us.
- We will also be identifying the main parts of the body and how they work, as well as learning how to look after our body.
- In addition, we will further develop our understanding of children's rights as a Rights Respecting School.

Religious & Moral



We will be exploring stories from world religions and be able to describe some of their key beliefs and values.

We will also discuss our own beliefs

We will look at the moral stories of 'The Impoverished Son' (Buddhism) and 'A Brother Like That' (Islam).

Numeracy & Mathematics



This term, we will further develop our mental agility skills. We will also be developing skills in-

- Number bonds and facts within 20 and bevond
- Numbers up to 1000 recite, write and order.
- Place value e.g., 67 is 60 +7, 124 is 100 + 20 + 4.
- Using and applying mental and written methods for addition and subtraction.
- Numbers Talks strategies to develop our mental maths capabilities.

Technologies



We will be using our ICT skills to enhance our learning across the curriculum.

We will also develop our use of-

- Microsoft Office Applications
- Keyboard skills
- Internet Safety
- iPad applications
- Search engines

In addition, we will use digital technology to consolidate maths and literacy skills.

Science



This term, our topic is Planet Earth, and we will be learning about 'Insulation and Insulators'.

By taking part in investigations into how water can change from one form to another, we will develop skills in relating our findings to everyday experiences.

Expressive Arts



In Art, we will be developing our drawing skills with a focus on drawing from observation, using techniques to add texture and creating pictures with a foreground and background.

In Music, we will use the Charanga programme to explore our musical talents and develop skill in performing! Our focus is R & B music where we will listen, appraise and play instruments.

Through our Talk for Writing story, we will be introduced to freeze frames and will be encouraged to work together during drama performances.

Draw and describe what a Viking might wear.


Health & Wellbeing

Numeracy & Mathematics




Revise number bonds to 20.
