Language & Literacy

This term we will focus on-

- Higher order thinking reading strategies, including predicting and visualising.
- Active Literacy active spelling strategies
- Enhancing our skills in narrative writing through story mapping and innovating using Talk for Writing approaches.
- Developing our note taking skills across literacy activities.

Social Studies

Religious & Moral




Our focus this term will be on Refugees and how we treat each other.

We will explore why different people think that values such as honesty, respect and compassion are important, and we will demonstrate tolerance and respect for others.

To increase our understanding of how people come to have their beliefs and further develop our awareness that there is a diversity of belief in modern Scotland, we will explore 'Ways of Life' including food and fasting.

Numeracy & Mathematics



- Place value read, write and order 6-digit numbers.
- Estimating and rounding to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10,000
- Application of written and mental strategies to solve addition and subtraction calculations.
- Number Talks strategies across maths learning.

Technologies

We will develop our research skills and talk about copyright.

We will be concentrating on how to keep ourselves safe online.

We will develop our problem-solving skills through the use of Sphero Indi robots.

Science





This term, our focus will be on forces, electricity and waves.

We will explore energy microbits and electrical circuits.

We will use a range of electrical components to help make a variety of circuits.

Also, we will explore sustainable energy sources.

In Art, we will further develop drawing skills to create images and objects which show awareness and recognition of detail. We will also focus on artist appreciation.

In Music, we will focus on identifying instruments and listening and singing from memory.

In Drama, we will develop our skills in movement, expression and mime, through our Talk for Writing lessons.

Health & Wellbeing

Discuss at home why honesty, respect and compassion are important.
Research up-to-date Refugee stories from different countries/cultures.

Think about how we treat each other – at home, in the classroom and in the playground.

Try different foods from different cultures.

Numeracy & Mathematics

Practise all multiplication tables. Ask an adult to ask you quick-fire questions.

Use estimation to keep a running total at the supermarket. See how close you got at the checkout!

Use Education City and Top Marks to play games -

- Place value.
- Ordering/comparing numbers.
- Addition and subtraction.

Technologies



Discuss internet safety and social media with people at home. What are their views?

Write a story using speech to text on Google Docs and e-mail it to your teacher.

How could technology help a refugee? (particularly if English is not a known language to him/her?)

Science



Visit the Science Centre.

Find examples of how forces are used in everyday life.

Discuss safety when using electrical appliances with someone at home. Design a new electrical appliance that could be useful in everyday life.

Expressive Arts



Choose an artist and compile a fact file on him/ her. Can you make an electronic version?

Design a different front cover for our class novel. Using mime and movement, act out the main character's first few days in his new school.

Visit a gallery or museum.
