# **Curriculum for Excellence What are we learning this term?**

## Room 6 Term 2



#### Language & Literacy

In Reading, there will be a focus on the comprehension strategies of connecting, questioning and evaluating. Our class novel this term will be Sulwe.

The children will continue to apply *The Five Finger* approach – say, make/break, blend, read and write to phoneme work. Strategies for spelling common words will include dictionary definitions and breaking the word into syllables.

In writing, we will use the model text 'Letter to a Penpal' to practise our formal writing format and vocabulary. We will continue to practise handwriting, ensuring correct size, height and formation.

#### **Social Studies**

The topic for this term is *Spectacular Strathaven; Our Community*. We will focus on-

- Considering ways of looking after the community and encouraging others to care for their environment.
- Exploring our community and the groups within it.
- Identifying and considering different types of housing and how they meet needs.

#### Sustainability

For Sustainability, we are focusing on:

- Plastics Reducing single use plastics.
- Carbon Travel Survey.

#### **Health & Wellbeing**



Our Health and Wellbeing focus will be on the wellbeing indicators Achieving and Nurtured.

In P.E. we will be developing skills in striking and fielding and orienteering. Later in the term, we will participate in Scottish Country Dancing.

As a Rights Respecting School, we will continue to offer opportunities for children to develop their understanding of their rights and how to apply them.

#### **Religious & Moral**

We will also be learning about How 'We Treat Each Other' and how this impacts us within our community.

The class will be studying the tale of 'Babushka' which is associated with Christmas around the world.



#### **Numeracy & Mathematics**

This term we will further develop our mental agility skills using Number Talks. We will learn to use 'Friendly Numbers' to help us with addition and subtraction.

We will also be developing skills in:

- Addition and subtraction to 100 using mental and written methods.
- Money identifying all coins and notes to £10 and calculating totals/ giving change within £1.
- Time Telling the time using quarter past using analogue and digital clocks.
- Applying numeracy skills in a variety of contexts across the curriculum.

#### **Technologies**

We will continue to use our ICT skills to enhance our learning across the curriculum. We will also develop our skills in:

- Using I-Pads to capture and edit images.
- Using Microsoft packages to create and save documents.
- Making use of search engines to research specific facts and information.
- Developing coding skills using the Sphero Indis.
- Sewing



#### Science

In Science, we will be creating and investigating magnetic forces.

We will:

Conduct investigations into magnetic and non-magnetic materials.

Learn about how magnets are used in everyday life.

Apply our knowledge of magnets to make a magnetic game for others to play.

#### **Expressive Arts**

- In art, we will develop skills in painting using primary and secondary colours, using textures and lightening/darkening tones.
- In drama and music, we will develop our performing skills through our Nativity play.
- We will also be learning our carols for the 'Coffee and Carols' evening.


