

Home Learning for Primary 1a

20th to 24th April 2020

Literacy and English

- Continue to practise phonemes covered (draw pictures, write words with the phonemes)
- Practise new sounds ch and ng (sing Jolly Phonics songs, watch Mr Thorne videos, watch Alphablocks ch and ng videos)
- Have a go at writing common words using colour spelling (red for tall letters, green for hanging letters, yellow for small letters).
- Common word treasure hunt hide words around the house, read and write as many words as you can find.
- Listen to a story on 'Audible' or read a story you have at home. Discuss the characters and events. What happened at the beginning, middle and end?
- Be a text detective, find words in the story with 3, 4 or 5 letters. Can you find any word with the ch and ng phoneme?
- Write a postcard to a friend tell them about what you have been doing at home.

Maths and Numeracy

- Continue to practise number stories and adding bonds.
- Practise counting on/back to 20. Ask questions What is before, after, one more, less?
- Write numbers to 10 on pieces of paper. Pick two or three numbers. Put these in order from smallest to biggest, biggest to smallest, find the biggest/largest/least/smallest etc. Extend to numbers to 20.

- Draw/colour a picture of a woodland animal. Can you label the different parts of the animal? eg. tail, nose, paw, beak.
- Create a woodland animal fact file. What do they eat? Where do the live?
- Listen to a Woodland animal story on 'Audible' or read a book you have at home eg. The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark, Beatrix Potter, Winnie the Pooh. Can you create your own story about a woodland animal?
