Literacy and English

Reading

- Choose a fiction novel and choose 2 characters to create a Visualiser for. Use this information to draw a picture of them. Remember to include quotes, speech marks and page numbers to back up your descriptions. (You could describe their appearance, personality and background etc.)
- Find 5-10 unfamiliar words in your book and use the Metalinguistics strategies to say what you think the words mean, based on the context around it and the dictionary definition.

Spelling

- From the spelling lists provided, Sapphires revise your last two weeks phoneme and common words. Amethysts create more words for your phoneme family, same sound as last week. Diamonds find more words with your affixes from last week. Use some of the spelling activities you do in class to practise your words. (Remember all your previous sounds are in your homework jotters.)

Writing

- Use [Pobble 365](#) (online) as a stimulus for writing your own story. There is a new stimulus (picture) each day, with activities. You can go back and use previous pictures.

Maths and Numeracy

- Practise your times tables – also state multiplication/division facts e.g. $9 \times 5 = 45$, $5 \times 9 = 45$, $45 / 9 = 5$, $45 / 5 = 9$.
- Practise telling the time analogue/digital/24 hour and stating time durations.
- Explore weight/length through practical activities at home e.g. measuring food, baking.
- Remember all the maths games we use in class that you can use to practise all maths concepts e.g. [Top Marks](#), RM Easimaths, [Sum Dog](#), [Education City](#) and [Timestables.co.uk](#).
