### OUR PRIORITIES

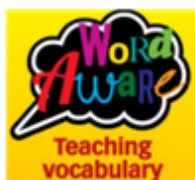
#### Literacy—Book Breakfast

## Science

Science Week this year is busier than ever! We were lucky enough to obtain a grant from British Science Week to purchase materials for our science investigations. Several STEM ambassadors are working with classes on a variety of STEM activities. We are lucky enough to have secured funding from the National Space Academy for P6 and P7 to participate in a PPG science master class. This has been designed to use "space" as a context to tackle the curriculum, linking science and engineering with space science and technology to engage young people with the science! Forth Valley College will again be participating hosting a rocket laboratory!

Stirling University will be participating with our STEM career talks, with both professors and research associates talking about their work. A fantastic link for our pupils, and we hope to develop future collaborations with both FVC and Stirling University.

Miss White is working with us and creating exciting science in music workshops to deliver. Mrs Malcolm is working on a special project based on Victorian Orphans and the science of photography.

On Thursday evening, Stirling Astronomical Society is opening the observatory at Stirling Highland Hotel for parents and pupils (5 years and over) to come along and hopefully get a chance to look at the stars and explore our solar system. Booking forms are handed out to classes – book early as this was a sell-out last year!

Miss Shrimpton is working in the nursery on Monday 11 March supporting a Learning Together Time with pupils and families developing their curiosity for science. A talk with parents and carers will also give parents 'hands on' ideas for science activities at home.

Finally – look out for the family challenge! What will it be this year?
