### OUR PRIORITIES

#### Developing Our Young Workforce & Creativity

Our Makerspace Week in November was a huge success! The children and staff team really enjoyed the new experience. We were highly impressed with the results. Throughout this week, we observed a high engagement level and children were developing the essential 21st century skills in collaboration, creativity, communication, critical thinking and curiosity. Our children demonstrated a true commitment to solving the set challenges as they were real-life, purposeful problems. Our next Makerspace Week is scheduled for week beginning 25 February. Each class will receive a challenge which they must complete by Friday 29 February. A huge thank you to Mr Downs for organising such innovative challenges!



#### Literacy

We hosted a very successful Read Write Inc. phonics event in November for our P1 parents, providing an opportunity for them to hear and see in practice how we teach our new phonics programme. Feedback from the parents who attended was very positive. We are very encouraged by the children's enthusiasm for their phonics learning, they are steadily becoming familiar with new routines and language. To assist the implementation of this exciting phonics programme all infant staff together with our Support for Learning teacher, Mrs Foran, attended additional training during November inset days. A further RWI event for P2 parents will take place in the near future, further details to follow.



Staff in stages P3-P7 also took part in Reflective Reading during our recent inset days. Created specifically for Scotland, Reflective Reading is a methodology that we plan to use as one of the tools to raise reading attainment within the school through the use of engaging ideas and activities linked to a variety of text.

## Head Lice Alert!

We have received a few reports that some of our children have had unwanted visitors! At this time of year, head lice seem to thrive! Please check your child's hair regularly and if you do find some unwanted visitors, please make use of the guidance offered on the NHS website <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/head-lice-and-nits>

### Wet Combing

*Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You should try this method first.  
You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits. There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you: wash hair with ordinary shampoo apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do) comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends.*
