'Learning Together' Programme

Music and Me

We are delighted to welcome back David Trouton back to Cornton Nursery. David has been delivering 'Music and Me' sessions to all children within the Acorn and Oak rooms.

The aim of 'music and me' is to develop and enhance a range of children's abilities: self confidence, self expression, concentration, group work, active listening, pre-reading skills and emotional literacy through participation in creative music making.





Transitions:

<u>Home to Nursery:</u> Staff share that they feel home visits remain the most valued part of our nursery settling- in process. Children engage in play with staff in the security of their own homes and watch their family engage in conversation. Afterwards, when children first visit nursery they see familiar faces and adapt more readily. Please share your home visit experiences with us on our 'Just a Thought' Sheets in the foyer, these help us to continue to get it right for you and yours.

Acorn to Oak Room: Children can enter the Oak room when developmentally ready to play and learn within the Curriculum for Excellence. Children in the Acorn room play and learn within the Pre Birth to Three curriculum, but may stay for shorter or longer periods of time depending on which curriculum better supports their individual needs.

Nursery to School Transition: Regardless of what primary school you have enrolled in, our nursery to school transition programme has been designed to fill your child with curiosity, anticipation and excitement. This will begin just after the Easter Holiday. We will visit Cornton Primary each week as the famous sneaky mice! We will welcome children from other settings who have enrolled into Cornton Primary, to join our play experiences within nursery. Similarly, children who will not attend Cornton Primary will be fully included in this programme, with additional planned opportunities to engage with their new school community. Transition information and a newsletter will be given out at a meeting in Cornton Primary School for all parent/carers of children starting school in August 2019. This date of this meeting will be communicated with you within the next few weeks. Let the adventure begin...

<u>Snack:</u> Thank you to all who contribute to children's snack through donations in either Percy our Piggy Bank in the foyer, Parent pay or by purchasing items requested through Facebook or the basket in the foyer. This allows us to offer children two snacks per day, whilst being able to use our budget for nursery equipment and resources.
