#### 1. Welcome

Maureen Meredith chaired the meeting, as Gerry was unable to join us.

### 2. Minutes of previous meeting – 12 September 2017

Minutes were approved without revision. Proposed by Lynne Seaton, and seconded by Ado Adolphus.

#### 3. Homework Policy

Study Skills will be considered at another time. Thank you to Dougie Scott who attended the meeting to introduce the Homework Policy Review that is currently underway. The policy is being redrafted with the aim of presenting the results in the summer.

There are a number of areas of focus regarding homework.

- 1. Quantity a review of best practice and research is underway to ensure that educational improvement and attainment is raised by setting homework. Homework needs to be balanced with other extra curricular activities, and the amount set on a weekly basis should reflect the stage of the child. Approximately 10 mins of homework per year of formal education would be expected each school night. This relates to approximately 1 hour for S1 and S2, and 2 hours for S5 and S6.
- 2. Parental Engagement Balfron High School is using Show my Homework to inform children and parents of homework tasks. About half of all children in the school have accessed SMH, but only an eighth of parents have logged in. Although parents could be using their children's log ins, the aim is to improve parental involvement. This could be discussed at Form Class Leader interviews.
- **3. Non-completion of Homework** SMH can help advise parents of homework completion rates.
- **4. Feedback to teachers** It is important that teachers are made aware of how long homework tasks are actually taking children to complete. Teachers want to make sure that appropriate amounts of homework are set. There is currently a perception that S1-S3 receives too little homework, whilst S4-S6 receives too much. It would be ideal to have a gradual build of homework involvement and self-study from S1 to S6.
- **5. Protocol for Missed Deadlines** needs formulated.
- **6. Development of Good Study Skills –** homework encourages the development of good study skills and self-discipline.

A survey to invite parental views is being drafted, the results of which are expected by Easter.

**National 5 Study Skills** 

There followed some discussion about supporting children taking National 5's, their first external exams.

- S4's have attended 'Live and Learn' training in school, focusing on study success
- Form Class Leaders have blank timetables available for pupils to make study plans
- Summary notes and Flashcards are recommended and may be drafted in class
- Scholar is a very useful resource for Highers and increasingly National 5's
- SQA Guidelines online resource, giving access to full syllabus of each subject and exam structure

#### 4. Introduction to new Curricular Model

Amanda Short has been developing the new timetable for Balfron High School's new curricular model. The new model will come into effect from June 2018 with the current S1's moving into S2. The major change is that all pupils will take 7 subjects at National 5, going on to 5 subjects at Higher. It is hoped that this model will allow pupils access to more choice in their Higher year.

### In summary

**\$1** remains unchanged as currently working well, and the pupils are happy. It meets the Broad General Education curricular entitlements.

**S2** Will change from June 2018. The creative elective will be replaced by a period of music technology and drama for half the year.

**S3** Pupils will choose 9 subjects in addition to English and Maths (11 subjects in total). This compares to the 20 subjects that are currently studied in S3. After Christmas, the National Qualifications in all 11 subjects will be started and at the end of S3 pupils will specialise in 7 subjects.

**S4** Pupils will choose 5 subjects and English and Maths (7 subjects) to continue studying and prepare for national qualifications.

**S5** and **S6** will continue unchanged.

The new curricular model ensures that all pupils are offered the breadth of the Broad General Education specified in the curriculum entitlements, while providing some specialisation in S3. Almost all pupils will have experienced 3<sup>rd</sup> level in all available subjects in S2. This breadth is continued into S3 giving pupils more experience of a subject at National 5 level before committing to National Qualifications in S4. Seven subjects at National 5 will allow for greater choice when choosing (normally 5) subjects at the Higher level in S5.

# 5. Fundraising

There is a Family Christmas Quiz planned for the 15<sup>th</sup> December. The Insurance documents from this year's SPTC membership need to be tracked down (SH).

The Clothing Company will be at Killearn Country Market this month.

Amanda Quinn has applied for more grants. A grant from Aldi has been applied for Frisbee Golf as a community sport.

The 500 Club now has 142 members.

How can we advertise that the High School is in need of Funds? Could Parents in employment with big employers access funds? It was urged upon the members of the Parent Council to ask local groups and events if funding might be available.
