Proofs of cards are due to be sent home the week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> October with the deadline for parent orders set as Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November.

### Club Programme

This year all teachers will be helping to create additional opportunities for children to take part in clubs. The clubs will mostly take place over blocks of time during the lunch breaks although some will be arranged for after school, which would result in permission forms being sent home for those children interested.

Pupils also often volunteer to lead a club for peers or younger groups and support will be provided to ensure that his can take place successfully.

# School Football and Netball

This year we have three P6-P7 football teams that take part in weekly training and Active Stirling festivals. Well done to all of the players from Inter Yellows, Real Whites and City Blues who performed brilliantly with a sporting attitude in all of the games against other schools during our first festival, last week. Campbell Curtis and Andrew McLean, senior pupils from Balfron High are playing a valued role as coaches this year.

We are currently in the process of arranging some additional games against other schools, including Balfron v Strathblane on Friday November 18<sup>th</sup> at 4:00pm. These matches will be longer in duration and players will be selected from across all three of our training and festival squads. Permission slips for those involved will be issued nearer the time.

Our school also has three netball teams who successfully took part in a festival against other schools, earlier this week.

# **Active Stirling**

This term, on a Tuesday morning, different classes have been experiencing some Active Stirling sports taster sessions – P3 and P4 rugby as well as P5 athletics. The programme of tasters will involve all classes over the course of the year.

#### **Board Games**

As well as being part of our club programme for the year ahead, chess is proving a popular choice of activity for pupils across different classes. While it is our intention to purchase some new chess sets for pupil use, if there are any fully intact sets at home that are no longer required, we would be delighted to make use of them. We are currently finalising arrangements for all P6 pupils to take part in Bikeability 1 training during November. Once dates are confirmed, further information will be sent out to families.

### Primary Counselling Service

This year, across all Stirling schools, pupils are able to access counselling services if required. At assembly last week, children watched an introductory video about the helpful role that counselling might play if they have persistent worries or need to talk.

P2 have also been learning more generally about farming this term and enjoyed the visit of local farmer, Mrs Nicolson to the class in her role with RHET (Royal Highland Educational Trust)

## Young Leaders of Learning

Miss Brown and four pupils from P5 visited Riverside Primary School last week where the focus was to find out more about a Young Leaders of Learning training programme. Rebecca Gribben, Shona Coull, Alex Bark and Cameron Shearer met some other pupils from Deanston PS and Braehead PS and shared ideas and experiences of learning from their own schools. Our whole P5 class will continue to investigate and consider different and effective ways to learn that can be shared across our other classes.

### Lost Property

Lost school jumpers and jackets without name labels are stored in the school main entrance. Please feel free to come and look for that missing item of clothing before or after school.

### Water Bottles

We are trying to avoid using disposable plastic cups in school and to help us achieve that target all children are encouraged to carry their own water bottle which can be accessed at any point during the day when they need a drink. Parents are reminded that bottles from home for use during class time should be filled with water and not juice.

# **School Lunches**

Free school meals for pupils up to P5 continued from the start of term. Extension of free provision beyond P5 has not yet been arranged nationally and once in place, confirmed details will be sent out to P6 and P7 parents/carers. The current cost of lunch for pupils in P6 and P7 is £2:20 through Parent Pay.

# Parking/Campus Congestion

Following some recent incidents of concern, parents are asked to please show increased awareness of the school crossing patrol areas in and around the school campus and village.

To help avert an accident from happening, entering the school grounds by car during busy periods including 8:45am - 8:55am and 3:15pm - 3:25pm, unless absolutely essential, is not permitted.

Some residents on Moor Road have contacted the school, requesting that cars are not parked across driveways, or on the white lines, even for a short period of time, as this is blocking access.

A recommended alternative, used successfully by many parents, is parking at Donaldson Park and walking the short distance to school via the path.

Information from Schools, Learning and Education, Stirling Council Review of Organisation of Classes Policy 2022-23

If you would like to take part in a survey which is helping to review council policy on how classes are organised including the formation of composite classes – please follow the information below:

Three years on since the last review of Stirling Council's Organisation of Classes Policy, we are asking our parents/carers, staff and pupils in our primary schools 'What works well in relation to organisation of classes?' and 'What could we do better?'

While individual experiences from within the Stirling area may be different, we want to hear from a wide cross-section so we can continue to ensure our services and supports are meeting our children's needs.

This 2022/23 review will consider relevant existing policies from across Scotland, national requirements and advice, and will include feedback gathered from primary headteachers, school staff, pupils and parents/carers. An online consultation on Engage will be one of the methods used to gather views. Information from the review will inform the revised Organisation of Classes Policy.

This consultation is open to parents/carers, members of staff and headteachers in Stirling Council primary schools.
