Dear Parents/Carers,

This month I have the following news items to share:

## Morning Routine

To help ensure that all children are safely in school each morning, ready for the important daily routine of registration, lunch ordering and getting ready for the first learning task, all parents/carers are reminded of the following:

### Be in school on time

• Avoid lateness – please have your child in the playground morning line at 8:55am **Parking** 

- To help avert an accident from happening, entering the school grounds by car during busy periods including 8:45am 8:55am and 3:15pm 3:25pm, unless absolutely essential, is not permitted.
- Moor Road parking the turning point or on the kerb at the playground double gates is <u>not</u> for parking. This creates additional congestion around the school which can be dangerous. New signage for the turning point is being ordered by the school as a permanent reminder to parents and other visitors.
- Moor Road parking some residents have contacted the school, requesting that cars are not parked across driveways, or on the white lines, even for a short period of time, as this is blocking access.

A recommended alternative, used successfully by many parents, is parking at Donaldson Park and walking the short distance to school via the path.

## Parent Council

The next meeting of our Parent Council will be held on Wednesday at 24<sup>th</sup> April 7:00pm in the primary school.

This year we have worked closely with the Parent Council committee on replacing the current Storyworld reading scheme which is used mostly in P1-P3. In addition to a new Word Sparks reading scheme for our youngest classes, we have also purchased a 3-year licence for Oxford Reading Buddy which is an online resource that will be used for comprehension mainly in P4-P7.
