Welcome back to a new school year!

Morning Routines

We are delighted that the term has started with significantly reduced pupil lateness in the morning. It is very important that all children arrive in time for the 8:55am bell to enable essential administration, including registration and lunch ordering, to be completed accurately first thing by the class teacher.

Campus Safety

Over the holidays work has been started to install zebra crossings at two points within the entrance areas of the campus. This work is not complete and the existing crossing patrols continue to be in place.

While no date has yet been given for the ending of the crossing patrols, all parents/carers must now avoid driving into the campus between 8:30am and 3:30pm.

Recommended alternative parking is in the Church/Donaldson Park car park which is only a short walk to the school.

Additional steps that are planned over the next few weeks include -

- Displays around the campus reminding parents/carers of the 'no parking' expectations. PC
 Barclay, who has a campus role, will also at times throughout the year monitor cars and buses
 within the campus, providing advice where required.
- Regular road safety information and reminders to pupils at weekly assemblies and within the curriculum
- A special P1-P7 Balfron Campus road safety assembly on Friday 6th September which will include a talk by PC McCammon.

While all of these steps, if followed, should make a positive difference to road safety for our pupils as we transition from supervised crossing patrol to unsupervised zebra crossings, the campus will remain busy.




<u>Sickness</u>

At the start of the year it is important to remind parents that in order to reduce opportunities for spread of infections, when children suffer from a sickness or diarrhoea bug they should not return to school until 48 hours after the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea.

Last session we were advised by a few parents that their children had contracted threadworms; therefore as a reminder for the year ahead we again include the NHS guidance for your information and would ask that you check and get the appropriate treatment from your GP/Pharmacist if required and remain vigilant over the coming weeks. Handwashing is particularly important and this message is also being reinforced in school.

Meet the Teacher Wednesday 4th September

As usual, our Meet the Teacher evening will be divided into two sessions, 5.00pm - 5.30pm and 5.30pm - 6.00pm and will provide parents in P1 – P7 the opportunity to meet with their child's new teacher, find out about class routines as well as learning and teaching in the classroom. Individual pupil progress will not be the focus for the evening. The second session will be a repeat of the first one and allows parents to visit two different classes.

There will be no crèche facilities during Meet the Teacher though pupils are welcome to attend class presentations.

A class newsletter will also be sent home to families summarising how learning will be planned from August to December.

Flu vaccines for P1-P7 will take place on the morning of Monday 4th November. Consent forms from NHS Forth Valley have already been issued and should be returned to the school office by Monday 26th August.

It will feature a wide range of activity providers from across the food, farming and environmental sectors.

NSPCC

The NSPCC <u>Speak out Stay safe</u> programme is a free safeguarding programme consisting of child friendly, interactive video assemblies and supporting lesson plans, activities and resources. In Stirling NSPCC also offers volunteer led follow up workshops for P3, P6 & P7 after staff have delivered the assemblies.

The programme aims to help children:

- understand abuse in all its forms and recognise the signs of abuse;
- understand that abuse is never a child's fault, and they have the right to be safe;
- know how to get help, and the sources of help available to them, including the Childline service.

There will be two NSPCC assemblies on Friday 20th September – the first for P1-P3 and the second for pupils in P4-P7. Separate workshops for P3, P6 and p7 will take place on Monday 30th September.

Pupil Achievement

Last term, Effie Larkin P4 raised the fabulous amount of £450 for Cancer research by taking part in a Race for life event. We were delighted to share Effie's picture with her medal on the school foyer screen.

Mobile phones

Mobile phones are not required in school to support learning in class and therefore the expectation is that they are <u>not</u> brought into school by pupils.

If on an exceptional case, some parents require their child to have a phone for contact purposes after 3:15pm, for example if attending an after-school club or bus journeys, phones should be kept in bags at all times during the school day. Please note that Smart watches with phone access should also not be brought into school.

Playground

Many of our children enjoy exploring our bushes and trees during playtimes. Playground staff as part of their supervision duties, encourage pupils to play creatively and the abundance of hedges and trees

certainly support exciting and imaginative pupil ideas. While pupils are closely monitored and are not allowed to climb high within any hedge or tree, occasionally some children do get scratched by twigs etc. when they climb or get down. When a child does get a scratch or small injury a record slip will be sent home. If you do not want your own child to climb or explore within our school grounds please do make sure that they are clear of your expectations, as well as informing the school.

Dogs in the playground

Parents are reminded that dogs, even on leads, are not permitted in any part of the school playground either at the beginning or end of the school day.
