This month, I have the following news items to share

### **Acting Depute Headteacher**

Following interviews this week, Ewan Logan has been appointed as Acting Depute Headteacher to cover the period of Mrs Macmillan's maternity leave.

Mr Logan is currently Principal Teacher at Borestone Primary in Stirling and it is hoped that he will be able to begin his new role with us on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April.

Mrs Macmillan's last day with us, before she begins a twelve month period of maternity leave is due to be Friday 25<sup>th</sup> April.

### **Parents' Evening**

Parents' Evening appointments will take place next week on Wednesday 19th March 5:00pm - 7:30pm and Thursday 20th March 3:30pm - 6:00pm with individual appointment slips already issued.

### **Organisation of Classes – 2025/2026**

Due to a larger P1 enrolment than expected, it is anticipated that next year we will have a P1 and a P1/2 composite class.

The structure of all other classes in session 2025/2026 along with teachers have still to be organised and will be confirmed to parents and pupils during the summer term, once placing requests and deferred entries are finalised.

Stirling Council's 'Organisation of Classes' policy was explained at the recent Parent Council meeting and again at this week's Thinking About P1 parent information session. A copy has been attached as an appendix to today's newsletter.

The decision to create composite classes is taken in the best interest of all children in the school and is also guided by the requirement for our school to make sure that there is capacity to enrol any new pupils who move within the catchment area during the course of next session.

In deciding how to populate composite classes, headteachers will apply the following criteria:

- Each composite class shall have a maximum of 25 pupils as per national requirements.
- The lead factor in determining the population of the class shall be the date of birth of the child i.e. the oldest children from the younger stage join with the youngest children from the older stage. This criterion shall be used because it is unambiguous and transparent: for the purposes of school provision, age is not a 'protected characteristic' in the Equality Act 2010. This means that in relation to the provision of education, schools may lawfully use the criteria of age to organise classes.

- A reasonable balance in terms of gender, where possible.
- The range of Additional Support Needs spread reasonably across classes, evidenced through the Staged Intervention process.

Sensitivity should be given to exceptional individual circumstances related to additional support needs, with opportunities for discussion between home and school in relation to Additional Support Needs.

The overall decision should be made in line with policy and criteria, with the final decision resting with the headteacher, who has knowledge of all children and families in the school.

### **Guided Walks**

This week, pupils and teachers in P6 and P7 have taken part in a guided walk through Balfron, led by local historian Jim Thomson as part of the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of Alexander 'Greek' Thomson.

### **Hygiene**

Throughout the year we like to remind parents that in order to reduce opportunities for spread of infections, when children suffer from a sickness or diarrhoea bug they should not return to school until 48 hours after the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea.

Attached to today's newsletter is helpful guidance for parents produced by Public Health Scotland on infectious diseases. Please take time to read this important information detailing periods when children should/should not stay off school –

Last session we were advised by a few parents that their children had contracted threadworms; therefore as a reminder for the year ahead we again include the NHS guidance for your information and would ask that you check and get the appropriate treatment from your GP/Pharmacist if required and remain vigilant over the coming weeks. Handwashing is particularly important and this message is also being reinforced in school.

### **Should I keep my child off school or childcare?**



Illness	Until...
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the advice on NHS inform if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
