This session the Borestone Management Team have split Primary 7 into groups to support our young people and to start thinking about their transition to secondary school.

What happens in a Mentoring appointment?

The staff member will meet with your child individually each term to discuss

- What is going well in school
- What your child is proud of
- What your child is finding tricky
- What help is needed

This gives your child a chance to take about their progress in school and their mentor will help them identify targets and ways that they can help themselves and what others can do to help. Your child will be able to post their targets on SeeSaw so that parents can see what their children are working on

News from P6/5

This term P6/5 has started working towards their John Muir Discovery Award. As part of this we have been discovering and exploring our school playground and surrounding woods. We have built shelters, learnt about trees, measured their ages and researched their food chains. We have identified invertebrates and



enjoyed getting to know our surroundings through exploration and team work. The next step for our award will be to share our knowledge and think about how we can conserve and look after the nature around us.

P2DY have been enjoying their outdoor gym lessons this term and so far we have been very lucky with the weather.

News from P5MW

Primary 5MW have settled well into our new classroom. We have been discovering the woodland area around our school grounds as part of our topic. We have been researching, designing and building small animal shelters, designing animal playgrounds, building birds' nests and bird watching. Everyone is excited to be working towards the John Muir discovery award, and we will continue to learn outdoors as the year progresses.



We have also been focusing on our mental and emotional health and wellbeing through the Emotion Works programme. We are learning about the 5-cog model and applying this learning across the curriculum.

P2M have been focussing on health and well-being and are enjoying getting outside as



much as possible. We love our new P2 area to play in.

We are continuing to enjoy learning about emotions and can identify lots of ways we feel and do a daily emotional check-in.

We enjoyed reading 'While we can't hug' and made some cards for people we love and are missing during lockdown.



Each child has now been sent home with an invite letter for Seesaw. This is a digital platform that we will be using for profiling our learners' progress from Nursery to P7. The children have been familiarising themselves with Seesaw and have uploaded some learning posts that they are proud to share with you at home.

If you have a Smartphone or tablet, you can download the Seesaw Family app from the App Store, Google Play Store, Kindle store or via a Chromebook. Once you have done this, create an account and use the QR code scanner in the Seesaw Family app to scan your child's unique code. Don't worry if you don't have a Smartphone or tablet, your child's Seesaw account can also be accessed on a laptop or computer via the web link on the invite.

You can allow up to 10 family members access to each child's digital portfolio. This can only be seen by the class teacher, child and their family members. Families cannot see the names or progress of any other learners in the class. The content of each child's journal is safe, secure, private and never shared publicly. We would encourage you to have a look at what your child's been learning, discuss it with them and add any positive comments or feedback where appropriate.

If you have had any issues in setting this up and getting started, please contact the class teacher or Mr. Logan via the school office for support in doing so.

If you have any further questions or issues accessing the content, please don't hesitate to get in touch with us. We hope you enjoyed the videos and getting to know a little more about your child's teacher!

It remains the case that it is essential that people who have COVID-19 symptoms, or who share a household with someone who has symptoms, do not attend school and must self-isolate along with all members of their household.

The main symptoms of COVID-19 to be aware of are:

- new continuous cough
- fever/high temperature
- loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste

If, however, your child does not have symptoms of COVID-19 but has other cold-like symptoms, such as a runny nose, they do not need to be tested and they and you do not need to self-isolate. Your child can attend school if fit to do so.

I ask for your support in ensuring that we are aware of the specific reason for absence if your child is going to be absent from school.

If the reason for absence is due to your child demonstrating at least one of the three COVID-19 symptoms above, then please do advise us in your communication that you are seeking a COVID-19 test, that your household will be self-isolating and that you notify us of the outcome of the COVID-19 test.

Returning from a country that's on the quarantine list

As the October holidays approach, you may be thinking of taking your family abroad. If you are, I would respectfully remind you that if you return from or travel through a country which is on the quarantine list, you should not send your child back to school until they have completed the required 14 days quarantine period.
