#### **Numeracy and Maths**

This could be a daily task or as often as you wish. Choose a 3,4,5 or 6 digit number. Do the following to the number each time:

Write it in words

Partition it (356 = 300 + 50 + 6)

Write the number immediately before it.

Write the number immediately after it.

Ts it even or odd?

Write 3 even numbers before it.

Write 3 odd numbers after it.

Double the number.

If it is even, find ½ of it.

#### **Numeracy and Maths**

If you have a pack of Playing cards why don't you play on your own or with a family member.

Turn 2 Cards over and either add them, subtract them, multiply them. You decide! See how quickly you can get to the end of the pack. Perhaps when you get better at it you could be timed.

#### **Numeracy and Maths**

If you are able to, go on a family walk and see what 3D objects you can see. (eg: house cuboid and triangular prism, bin - cuboid)



#### **HWB**

If you are able to please could you write down and send to us on Seesaw your achievements both in and out of school in P5. (eg: are you part of a team/Club? Do you do gymnastics? Do you play an instrument?)

<u>Week 1</u>: Google 'Crunchy Carrots: from farm to fork' and watch the 3 min 50sec video clip (Tesco eat happy project). Choose 3 interesting facts to share with a member of your family.

Week 2: Google 'Crunchy peppers: from farm to fork' and watch the 3 min 12sec Video Clip (Tesco eat happy project). Again Choose 3 interesting facts you learned to share with your family or in as Creative a way as you want draw the journey a pepper takes from being grown to being on your plate at dinner.
